
William Henry Service Sr. (marked with X) working at Milton Brickyard ~ circa 1900 ~






Milton Heights Brickyard ~ circa 1890 ~ James Service is standing at the far right.

Mariah (Scriber) and William Alexander Service ~ circa 1870 ~



The Service family came to Canada via the United States in the mid 1. They were of Scottish descent and worked the rich farmland Nassagaweya for well over 150 years.

William Alexander Service, the first recorded member of the family Halton, was born in the Campbellville area about 1830. As a young may worked the area farms as a labourer, and in 1859 he married Mariah Scringer They established their own home in a lovely board and batten house we once stood where the Kelso Conservation Authority gates are now located.

William and Mariah Service were staunch Methodists and rais young family on the lands that now form part of the Halton Reconservation Authority and the Ontario Agricultural Heritage Park.

Their family consisted of three girls and three boys: Margaret Elizal Lucinda, William Henry, Richard Alexander, James Alexander and Chri Mary.

William and Mariah died just before the turn of the last century and are buried in unmarked graves in Campbellville.


The eldest daughter, Margaret (born August 28,1860), was married Isaac Hilson on November 15, 1882. There were two children from this riage. Isaac passed away six years later, and then Margaret married Mic (Jack) Mc Laughlin. The McLaughlins had four children. After Jack's dea 1912, Margaret operated a boarding house in Milton Heights for brick and lime kiln workers. Margaret died February 28, 1937.

Lucinda Service was born in 1863. She married Richard Ferrier on M 23, 1880.

William Henry Service, the eldest son of William Alexander and Mawas born on December 11, 1864, and worked in the lime kilns at Kelso young man and farmed in the Moffat area. He married Gertrude Cardine September 29, 1886, and raised two children: William Henry (McDonald's grandfather who was born July 29, 1890) and Margaret (born July 30, 1892). The eldest daughter, Eva Josephine, was born Ma 1888 and passed away at the tender age of five months on October 8, 1 William owned Lot 11, Concession 6, between 1894 and 1900. Land region records show that he purchased Lot 18, Concession 6, in Nassagawey April 1912. The Service family farmed there for another 40 years. William operated a blacksmith shop on the property for a number of years.

William Henry Jr. married Ellen Peer from Kilbride on March 24, 191 the Moffat United Church. They raised eight children at the Lot Concession 6 farm until they moved onto Bruce Street in Milton after set the farm about 1951. Will and Ellen's family consisted of Henry Alexan (born 1916) who lived in the Kitchener area, Jessie Josephine (born 1918)
