## Regional Chairman seeks re-election

Joyce Savoline may have been raised in Shanghai, China, but her heart resides in Halton. A resident of Burlington since 1973, Ms. Savoline is passionate about the democratic process and the rights of residents, a view that is not surprising considering her family's history. Ms. Savoline's mother's family, Greek Orthodox Russians, fled their home in Manchuria, on the border of Russia, to escape communism. Her father's family also fled their home in Spain, at a time when Jewish families were persecuted by the Spanish Inquisition. Savoline's parents met and married in Hong Kong, but fled with their two daughters to an immigration camp during China's civil war. Unwilling to live under communist rule, her family immigrated to Canada in 1953.

"I am one of the proudest, most passionate Canadians you'll find," exclaims Chairman Savoline. "My family's history has made me appreciate all the more the quality of life we have, and why it is important to enhance and protect it."


Ms. Savoline has always been an active member of her community, dating back to the days when she and her husband, Ron, were raising their two children. Not only did she volunteer her time as a Girl Guide and Cub leader, but also Ms. Savoline was co-founder and first president of the Pearson Nursery School. The school specialized in making connections between preschoolers and members of the community. Realizing just how much she enjoyed working with the people of her community, Ms. Savoline chose to run for Regional councillor in 1982, winning that election over a nine-year incumbent.

Appointed Chairman of the council in 1994 and 1997, Ms. Savoline felt strongly that the position of Chairman should be an elected one and initiated a council request to the provincial government to decide the position by public vote. In 2000, Ms. Savoline made history as the first elected Chairman of the Region of Halton.

She laughingly describes the position as a "24/7 job" but is quick to add, "I thrive on the busyness and the diversity of the things that need to be attended to."

Chairman Savoline announced her intention to seek re-election in early July, saying: "There are so many things that are unfinished that I would like to continue on. I get involved in issues that are important to where I live, where my family lives and where my neighbours live. They help to create a great way of life."
