



SHOEBOX



Tames Hall and his wife, Mary Skirrow, with children Ann, Jane and Robert Skirrow Hall came to Canada in 1824 from Lancashire, England. James bought 50 acres in 1826 at Lot 2, Concession 7, Esquesing. Mary's siblings, James Skirrow and his wife, Ann Howson; William; Isabella and her husband, John Atkinson; and Jane and her husband, Thomas Preston, settled in the same area around the present-day Hornby. In 1837, James bought 50 acres on Lot 3, fronting Trafalgar Road, and the rest of Lot 2 where Hornby Glen Golf Course is today.

James was a blacksmith by trade and used that skill in the new world. Mary died in 1832. James was married two more times, first to Ann Hodkinson and then to Margaret Hetherington.

Mary and James had seven children. Ann married John Gill, and Jane married Thomas Gill. They went to Huron County. Mary married James Hall Jr., a son of James's brother, Thomas, of Roeburndale, Lancashire. They settled in Haldimand County. Isabella married her cousin, James S. Preston, and they farmed on Lot 4, Concession 8, Esquesing. Susannah married Alexander Fleming, and they settled in Haldimand County. Elizabeth married Robert Howson, and they farmed in Huron County. Elizabeth also had a second marriage to John Taylor.

James and Mary's only son, Robert Skirrow Hall, married Eliza Boomer and farmed on the homestead. They had two sons and two daughters. Sarah married James Lush Collis and farmed in Eramosa. Mary married John Wrigglesworth, and they farmed at Lot 8, Concession 8 on Trafalgar Road. Their farm had Ashgrove School on the corner. After Robert died in 1884, John bought the Hall homestead from the estate. He sold part of it to their son, Fred Wrigglesworth, and his wife, Ida. Fred was a top horseman. The couple had three children. Clifford farmed the family farm with his wife, Margaret Stephens. Clifford and Margaret were very involved in their community. They sold the farm in 1962 and built a house on the corner of the property.
