COMMUNITY CORNERSTONE JENNY KITSON



In the hamlet of Eden Mills, most I residents are on a roster for assistance with the Community Hall, the centre of village life. It's where the exercise classes work up a little muscle; artists set up easels to sketch, paint and photograph the life models; and celebrations of all sorts take place.

from the hall, also assists in fund raising for the upkeep and accessibility funds by doing something a little more unique. Out in the nearby bush every March, using old-fashioned evaporator pans over hardwood fires, Ms. Kitson carefully boils down gallons of maple sap to create golden syrup which is then sold in small lots to net money for the community.

"I had about five gallons this year, which made approximately \$900," she says with a smile.

A self-employed computer trainer and programmer, Ms. Kitson juggles work with several other voluntary positions in north Halton and Wellington. She sings in the Guelph Chamber Choir and is a member of Vox Intoxicus, which she describes as "a fun group of six voices who sing for pleasure and occasional gigs." She's also a six-year volunteer and director of the Eden Mills Writers' Festival, an event that takes place every September. The festival creates a yearround position that chugs into gear soon after one event is complete so that there are constant improvements to the weekend of presentations to the literary crowd.

Without a doubt, however, some of her most interesting and important work is the gathering of food to feed the needy.

"I started in 1992 with an organization called Feedback Canada. They

individuals are included in that catch-all - Ms. Kitson makes the rounds of vendors just before noon at the Milton Farmers' Market each Saturday, collecting from June to October.

"The vendors are very good to me and save some foods especially. By August I can fill two pickups with food each time. There are fresh fruits and vegetables, baked goods, and often jars of jam or something with tiny dents in them. Occasionally I'll get meat given to me too."

After gathering the food into round bushel baskets, Ms. Kitson and another volunteer, Gloria Blanche, also of Eden Mills, use a borrowed pickup truck to make deliveries to Halton Women's Place, Hope Place, Halton Recovery House, a couple of group homes and Deborah's Home. After each place has taken what they need, any leftovers are then delivered to the Guelph Food Bank.

There are occasions when the summer bumper crops are too prolific and, if any group needs food, they are welcome to call Jenny Kitson regarding the surplus at 519-856-0591.

"There isn't anybody else gleaning at the market. I want to make sure foods aren't wasted and go to good homes. It seems to be a winwin situation," states Ms. Kitson.
