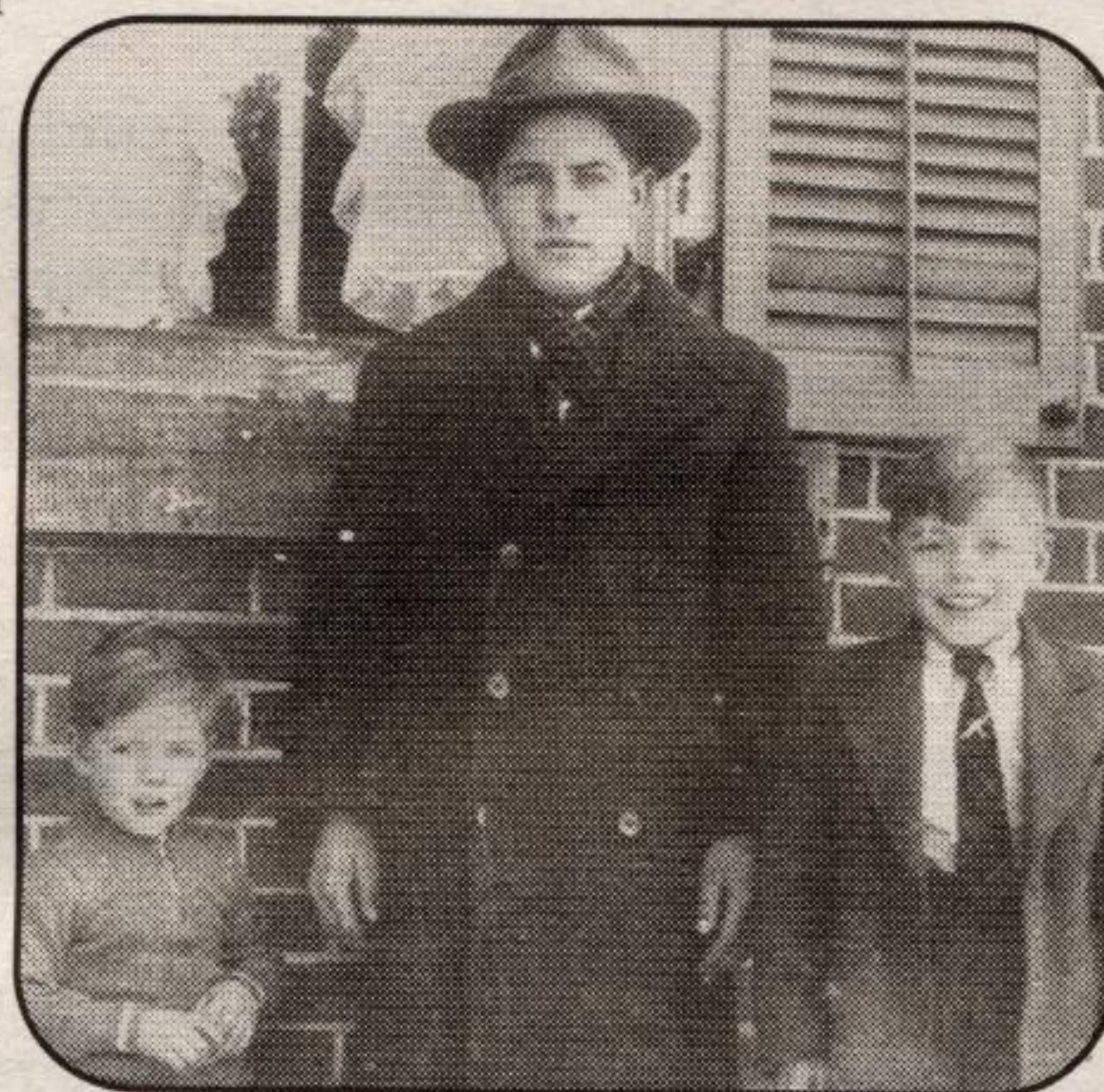

She married Horace Barnes who established Ashgrove Welding, later operated by son Fred and now by grandsons. Norman and Cora had seven children: Edith married Chester DeForest; he worked for Halton Region. Frances married Claude Twiss; they farmed and Claude also worked for Dave Green in the implement agency. Gilbert married Norma Evans; he established Bellworth Pump Service, now carried on by son Howard. Mabel married Harold Coulson, who worked for the Town of Milton and was a volunteer fireman. Jean married Vern Grenke who was a bank manager. John married Roberta Gaudry; he worked at a steel plant and was caretaker for St. Paul's United Church for many years. They live at Kitchener and are well known for their square dancing. Gordon married Mary VanGrunsven; he worked for Air Canada and their son Todd and his wife Lesley have a collectable action figurine business, "The Outer Reaches," in Milton. George Wrigglesworth II married Mary McDowell; their five children were Frank, Alfred, Walter, Gertrude and Harold. They farmed on the Fifth Line, Lot 11, Con. 5. He was Reeve of Esquesing in 1913 before they retired to Georgetown. Alfred married Frances Robinson of Trafalgar; they farmed on the Fifth Line and then went to Toronto. Walter married Annabelle Alexander. Her parents had a hotel and stagecoach stop at Ashgrove. Her brother William J. Alexander showed Jersey cattle and prize fowl at the fairs. Walter and Annie later lived near Rockwood with their three children. Correna married Clarence Strome and they lived in Guelph. Winifred married William Norrish, and they also lived in Guelph. George III (Ross) married Ida Gilroy. They lived in Streetsville and had three children; he managed a farm and then worked at a janitorial service. George IV and his wife Cavell live on the Fourth Line at Acton. He works for a hydraulic company. David and his wife Vivian live in Milton and David works at Ford. Allan and his wife Lynn live on Heritage Road and he works for a cement block company.
