

## More Milton mayoralty candidates

s the November 10 municipal relection rapidly approaches, the race for Milton Mayor becomes more heated. Along with incumbent Mayor Gord Krantz, current Councillor Regional Rick Malboeuf, David Lloyd and Vito Agozzino, both Al Volpe and Las Polcz cite frustrations with the current level of administration as one of the reasons they are seeking Milton's top spot.

Mr. Volpe has conducted business in Milton for over 20 years as a real estate advisor, financial planner and consultant. He is concerned about transportation issues facing Milton and calls for a comprehensive transportation infrastructure plan to deal with grid lock and slow road upgrades. It is his intention to promote small business development by offering tax incentives, grants and reward programs to business owners. He is blunt in his call to Town Hall to become less bureaucratic saying "that no longer will the concerns of large developers be expedited while many residents and small contractors wait six to nine months to get a simple building permit."

Equally outspoken in his criticism of Milton's policies is fellow candidate Las Polcz, who says he


