

With three out of four regional councillors new to the job in north Halton, here's hoping they're wise enough to rely on grizzled veteran Barry Lee, long-time Regional Councillor for Wards 1 and 3, Town of Milton, at least until they fully understand the issues.


With the Municipal Election of 2003 now over, The Compass has made a decision to follow a new editorial direction.
