# Boeing-Boeing

The first production for the 21st season of Theatre in the Trees at the University of Guelph is *Boeing-Boeing*, a French farce by

Marc Camoletti, translated by Beverley Cross. The play takes place in one day at a bachelor's apartment near Orly Airport, Paris. Bernard is a bit of a rake, stringing along three unknowing air hostesses as his one-and-only while they fly in and out to varied destinations on different airlines. Five stage doors and two hallways on the set are used to the actors' advantages, providing a non-stop flight to hilarity as two men, three girlfriends and a maid try to conceal the true nature of the intermingled relationships.

Bernard, played by Rob Gray, begins as a cool, suave businessman who believes that he truly adores all three women. The international harem is in perpetual motion so that Bernard has no chance of becoming bored. He encourages his visiting friend, Robert (played by Bill Smith) to engage in polygamy with his own household of air hostesses, stressing, "Fiancées are much more friendly than wives - and you don't need all that many... All you need is a timetable."

"What a marvelous idea," Robert counters. "One up, one down, and one pending!"

Bertha, the maid, is a rich characterization by Michelle Kreitzer - a familiar face to Theatre in the Trees attendees. Her expressions and actions define an opinionated French woman who is stressed by the fact that she constantly has to adjust the menus to suit the romantic encounters of her employer.

Janet, well played by Trish Starodub, is a smooth, confident American, who really isn't too


