

She is usually the one to staff Bruce Trail displays at events that draw the public. She also plays a role in organizing Bruce Trail Days, when hikers from all over the GTA gather in Halton Hills to celebrate or

take part in the large annual yard sale.

Having been a Bruce Trail member since 1982, and having served as president and director of trail maintenance for the Toronto club, she wanted to continue to hike, but not alone. She set up an information display to attract people interested in joining her, and announced scheduled hikes. "In the beginning nobody turned up but perseverance paid off and some people came out," she says.

Now she and other hike leaders offer organized hikes every alternate and weekend Wednesdays. In winter they offer cross-country skiing and hikes as weather conditions allow. They also

hold public information meetings and a Christmas pot-luck dinner.

"I have discovered beautiful scenery in Ontario that I never knew existed," Maureen says. "Hiking gets me out of the house, out in the fresh air and renews my spirits and relieves stress. It is one of the best means of improving one's heath and stamina without

the strains and stresses of running on the body. It has certainly improved my stamina and balance and I have enjoyed good health and energy for many years."
