A Capella Showcase goes 'Gold'

A Cappella Showcase has re-issued a CD of its music entitled A Cappella Gold that includes not only award-winning material sung by the women's singing group, but also an eclectic mix of music including country, rock n' roll, swing and

spiritual tunes. And there's also some barbershop music for listeners.

In the summer of 2002, includes songs such as Show Me Where the Good Times Are, In the Still of the Night, Crazy and Good Old A Cappella. It's what A Cappella's publicity coordinator, Jane Provins, describes as upbeat easy listening music. This is material that anyone familiar with the group will recognize as part of A Cappella's repertoire. But Mrs. Provins says there's a surprise thrown in too. The term A Cappella means without accompaniment, but the group defies its chosen name by singing Doo Wop Medley to background music.

The award-winning women's chorus is a member of Harmony Inc., an international organization of women that sing in four-part harmony, a cappella style. Each year, the group competes against other choirs that belong to Harmony Inc., both at the local level and internationally. For the last four years, A Cappella Showcase has won gold at local competitions. And the group has placed second, achieving silver, at international competitions. The CD includes Original One Step Dixieland and If You Love Me, two songs that A Cappella performed during competition.

Mrs. Provins says working on the emotional impact of their singing has made it possible for A Cappella to do well in competition. She explained that singers are not only judged on their music and singing, but also on their presentation. "Presentation would entail emoting, body movements, and facial expressions."



Mrs. Provins says someone in the chorus knew Elaine and decided it would be a nice idea to have her hear some of A Cappella's music. "She was extremely complimentary of our chorus and our director."

The group rehearses each Tuesday at the Ramada Inn in Milton beginning at 7:30 p.m. Anyone interested in joining the group, can come for an audition at that time.

A s I write this month's column and look out my window it is a grey, rainy day – not at all conducive to outdoor cooking! Lets hope that August will be more agreeable so that



we can move outdoors for some more casual and easy Summer entertaining.

This is a versatile recipe to take advantage of local produce. You can add or omit vegetables to suit your taste. Although the recipe calls for oven roasting, you can throw the pan on the barbecue if you don't want to heat up the kitchen.

Besides being a great, hot, side dish the vegetables are excellent served at room temperature with a drizzle of olive oil over them. Refrigerated left-overs are terrific added to a tossed salad the next day. My favourite way to eat them is on a crusty roll with cheese – very yummy. Enjoy!

Balsamic-Roasted Summer Vegetables

3 tbsp. balsamic vinegar

2 tbsp. olive oil

11/2 tsp. dried Italian seasoning

1/2 tsp. salt

1/4 tsp. freshly ground pepper

3 cloves garlic, crushed

1 1/2 cups asparagus (cut on an angle into 1 1/2 inch slices)

1 medium zucchini (cut on an angle into 3/4 inch slices)

1 medium yellow squash (cut same as zucchini)

2 large portobello mushrooms, stems removed and cut into 1/2 inch slices 1 large red onion cut into 8 wedges

1 large red bell pepper (cut lengthwise into 1/2 inch slices)

Preheat oven to 425°F. Combine first six ingredients in a large bowl and stir with a whisk. Add vegetables; toss well to coat. Arrange vegetables in a single layer on a jelly roll pan coated with cooking spray. Bake for 40 minutes or until tender and lightly browned, stirring occasionally. Serves 6.

The successful applicant must be a resident of Milton, or an owner or tenant of land in the municipality, or the spouse of such an owner or tenant, or employee of a business located in the municipality or student attending a school located in the Town of Milton, must be a minimum of eighteen years of age on the date of appointment, and must not be employed by the Board or by the municipality.
