In 1993 Colin Job, Ren's youngest son, took over managing the retail store allowing Ren to focus on the growing wholesale business. At first Colin handled responsibilities such as hiring the retail staff, ordering of the products and the dayto-day retail operations. In the last three years Colin has taken on many more responsibilities and between the two of them they oversee all the operations and make all the decisions. Now Ren can take the winters off and relax in sunny Florida knowing that the business is being well handled.

It is easy to see that both Colin and Ren value each other's opinions and abilities and are able to work well together as a result. This is one family that truly is a success story on every level.

The store atmosphere is positive and bright and has a knowledgeable staff, many of which are long-term Customers employees. enjoy browsing the wide selection of products for domestic animals including food, treats, litter, toys and accessories. The addition of more than 2000 new products proves that no one has more selection available than Ren's. On the side, Ren's also sells guinea pigs, gerbils, finches and budgies.

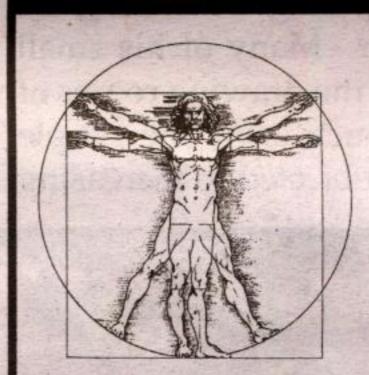
"WITHOUT THE CUSTOMERS WE DO NOT HAVE A BUSINESS"
