"The Mayor's Golf Tournament for the United Way of Milton has raised an incredible \$266,000 for the United Way since the Tournament's inception four years ago!" stated Mayor Krantz, tournament host and Honourary Chair of the United Way of Milton campaign. "This could not have been done without the tremendous support of the community."

"With just a few weeks to go, our volunteers and United Way staff are finalizing golf reservations, prize donations and sponsorships from local businesses and individuals alike. This tournament is an essential component of the United Way of Milton's annual campaign which has set its 2004 goal at \$425,000 in order to deliver funding to the 25 agencies working in Milton," Watson added.

Individuals can still play in the tournament for \$175 which includes golf, lunch, dinner and a gift for each player.

It's a 'best ball' format so you don't have to be a great golfer to still come out and have fun singly or as part of a foursome. 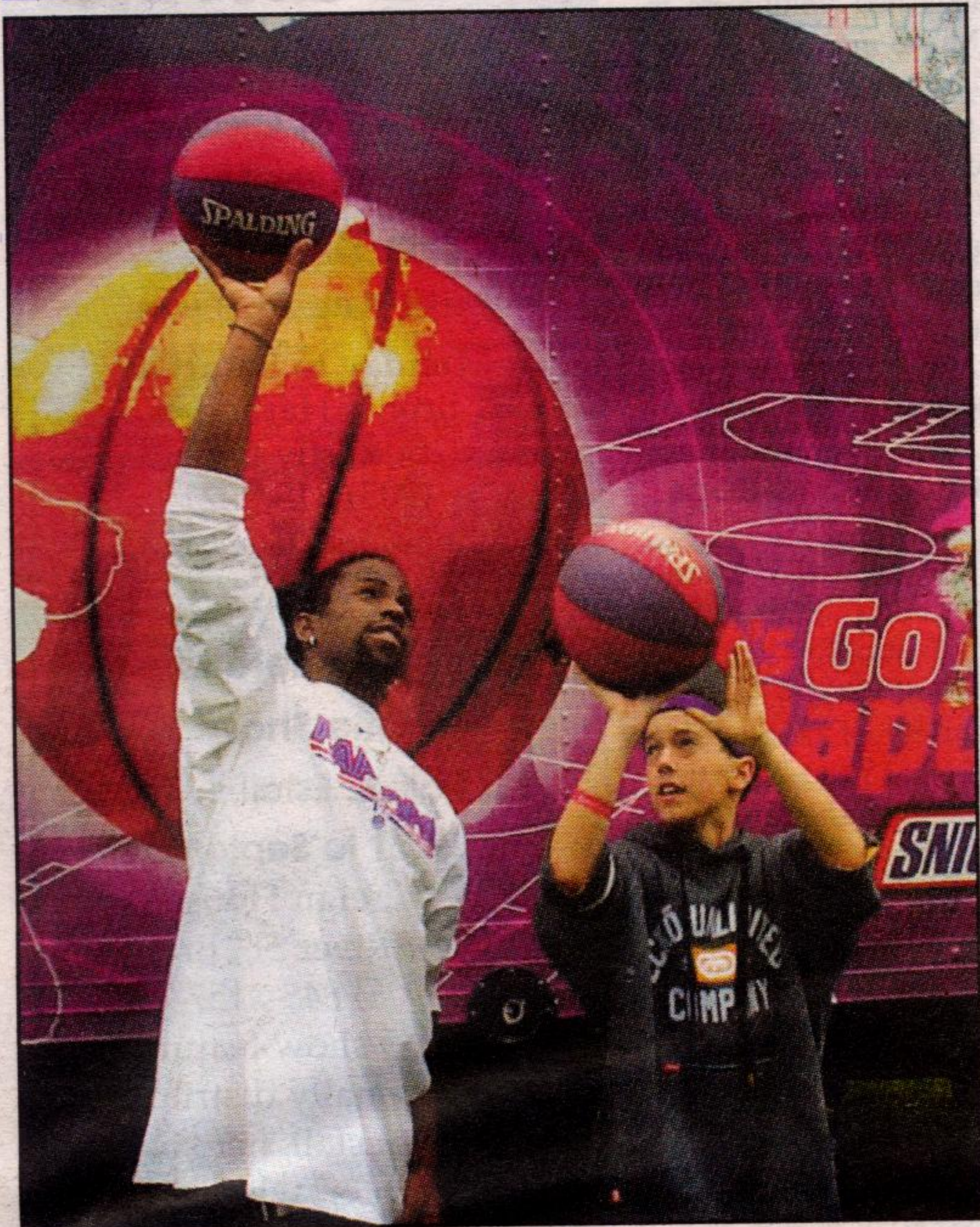
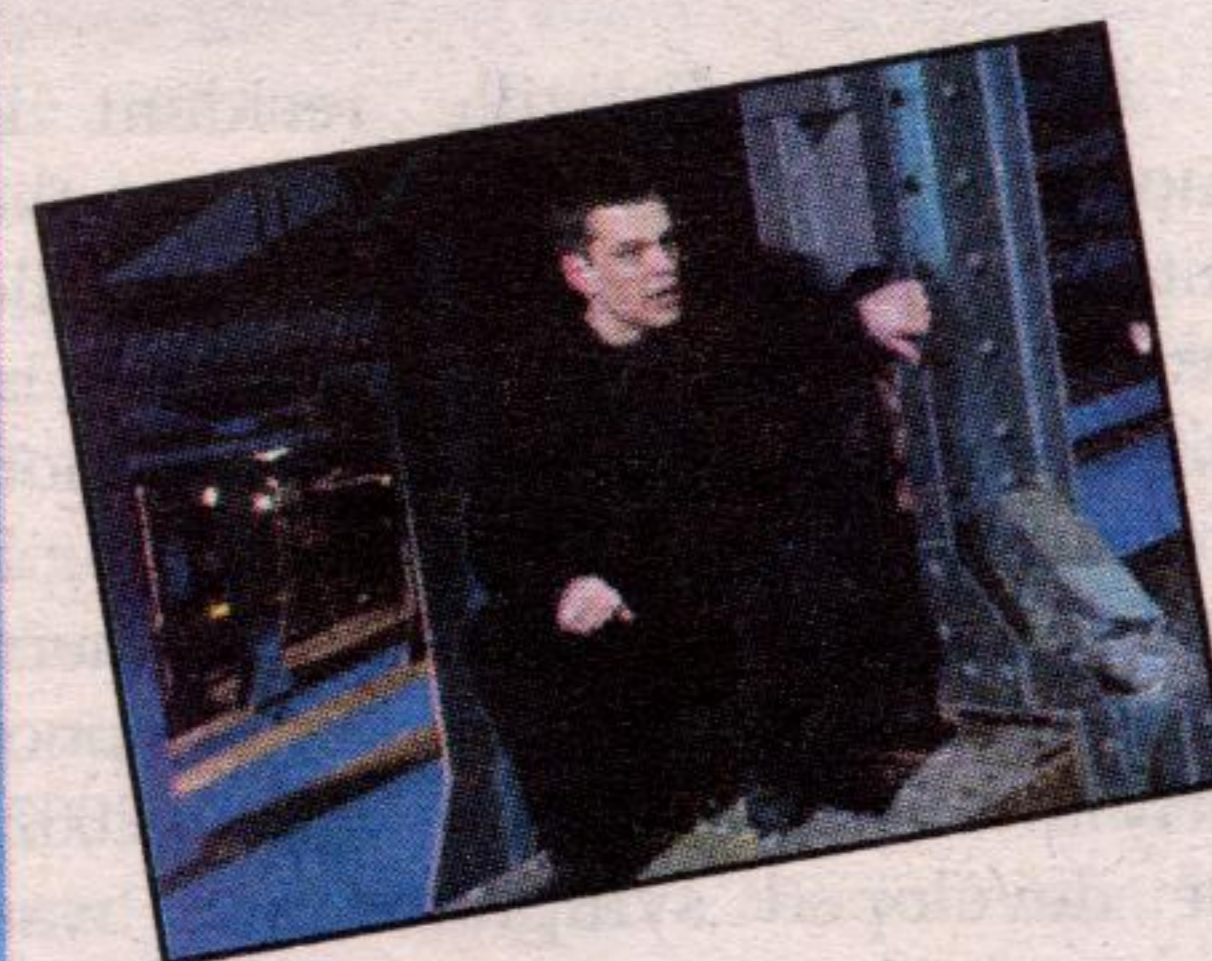

The Bourne Supremacy – Bond of the millennium?

Created after Robert Ludlum's novel, *The Bourne Supremacy* follows the great action, suspense and espionage of the first film *The Bourne Identity*. With Matt Damon as the returning star of the film, Jason Bourne, audiences are in for another thrilling ride of spy on spy pursuits.

The Bourne Supremacy follows the skilled assassin Jason Bourne as he tries to rebuild his life as a former professional killer. Overwhelmed by amnesia and nightmares of his previous career, Bourne worries this will haunt him forever. With memory fragments only reappearing in dreams and slight flashbacks, the character is forced to remain suspicious despite his new life and home in a different country. When Bourne realizes he is being trailed by a familiar face, the former assassin stops at nothing to find the source of his problems and set the CIA straight.

Set in several foreign locations, the edgy camera work demonstrates the innovative style of director Paul Greengrass. Although some scenes may leave audiences gripping their seat in anticipation, other parts of the film may cause motion sickness from the quick cutting and blurred lenses used in the filming.

While the cast is led mainly by star Matt Damon, the actors and actresses dynamic performances make this action adventure a great success. With names like Julia Stiles, Gabriel Mann and Joan Allen, this box office sensation has grossed over one hundred and twenty four million in the first three weeks alone! Although it's rated PG-13 for the violence and the occasional use of adult language, *The Bourne Supremacy* is sure to be a hit with thrill lovers everywhere!
