

Milton Council Notes

ON-LINE MAPPING: This new interactive and live web-based mapping system locates addresses, measure distances, prints maps, locates parks & facilities, identifies zoning...even helps potential investors locate available employment and industrial lands. Milton businesses are encouraged to hotlink their websites. www.milton.ca

MILTON FALL FAIR: 'No parking' designations were approved for roads adjacent to the Fair Grounds for the duration of the annual Milton Fall Fair, September 24, 25, and 26. (This Fair pre-dates the Town of Milton itself!)

FALL CLEAN-UP WEEK: October 12th - 16th the Brookville Operations Yard on Guelph Line will be open for disposal of large household items. This program offers rural homeowners a twice-yearly (spring & fall) opportunity to dispose of many large household items not included in the rural garbage and recycling collections. There are some restrictions on sensitive and toxic items.

BIKE PATHS: Following public consultation and review, a designated Bike Path will not be constructed within the Mattamy Wellwood and Brownridge developments. An alternate location of the bike path system will be considered through consultation with the Trails Advisory Committee.

ROAD PROJECTS:

LOWER BASE LINE between Ninth Line and Trafalgar Road: closed September 13, 2004 - May 7, 2005 (\$1,838,098 reconstruction)

SIXTH LINE from Lower Base Line to Britannia Road: closed September 15, 2004 to

May 6, 2005 (\$2,272,758 road reconstruction & replacement of Bailey bridge)

(Note for new residents: all 'Lines' north of Hwy. 401 include the designation of Nassagaweya to differentiate from those south of the 401)

SIXTH LINE NASSAGAWEYA: Culvert replacement south of 15 Sideroad has been postponed until June 2005 due to environmental concerns connected with the project.

15 SIDEROAD east of Sixth Line Nassagaweya will be partially closed on Thursday September 23 between 11 am and 3:30pm to facilitate the Grand Opening Rose Cherry's Home For Kids, Ontario's first paediatric hospice/respite home.

DERRY ROAD/COMMERCIAL STREET INTERSECTION: This intersection will be included in the Region's 2005 Capital program. However, the Region will review signal operations at intersections east & west of this location to determine if gaps can be created in traffic patterns to facilitate turning opportunities.

ANNUAL REPORT: The 2003 Annual Report for the Town of Milton is now available and posted on the Town's web site. It includes a summary of activities, projects, programs, and financial reports.

TEMPORARY USE BY-LAW: Council denied an application by Radha Soami Society Beas Canada for a temporary use by-law to permit a study center at 6566 Sixth Line south of Derry Road in the former Township of Trafalgar.

TWISS ROAD SPEED LIMIT: Reconstruction of Twiss Road between Derry Road & Steeles Avenue is designed for a 60

km/h speed limit. (Note: The speed limit from Steeles Avenue to Campbellville Road is currently under review.)

ANIMAL CONTROL BY-LAW: The second draft of this proposed by-law is now available for review on the Town's web site, and scheduled for consideration by Council's Community Services Standing Committee on September 13th.

HALTON MADD AWARENESS WEEK is proclaimed from September 20th to 24th. MADD buttons and red ribbons will be distributed at the Milton GO station on Friday morning, September 24th to raise awareness of the needless deaths caused by drinking and driving.

SENIOR'S ACTIVITY CENTRE: Everyone is invited to celebrate the 10th anniversary on Saturday, September 18th with activities, demonstrations, entertainment, and refreshments from 10:30am - 4pm with official ceremony at 12:30pm. Milton Seniors' Activity centre is located off of Ontario Street, adjacent to Allendale.

LIBRARY BOARD: Campbellville resident Brad Boehmer was appointed to fill a vacancy on the Milton Library Board.

FIRE PREVENTION WEEK is October 2nd - 8th. Station #2 (Emergency Response Centre on Reid Sideroad, Campbellville) and the Central Station (Steeles Avenue, Milton) will host activities from 10am to 3pm. Watch for more details.

COMMUNITY FUND: The deadline for fall applications is October 4th. This fund allocates approximately \$500,000 yearly to organizations. Guidelines are available on-line.

MILTON TRANSIT - The 'no charge' introduction to the new three fixed service routes continue until September 20th replacing the Dial-A-Bus system.

SHOPPING: Council approved conveying land and a future realignment of Nippissing Road for the planned redevelopment of the Milton Mall. Retail opportunities continue to multiply with the construction of Wal-Mart and a new Canadian Tire at Hwy. 401 & James Snow Parkway opening this fall. And for the best in Ontario produce, remember that Milton's famous Farmer's Market continues through October in the Historic Downtown. Main Street construction is on schedule for November completion.

IMMIGRATION POLICY: Council endorsed a motion requesting a Royal Commission to review Immigration policies including levels, funding mechanisms, and best practices model for all levels of government.

SHERIDAN COURSES: In partnership with the Town of Milton, Sheridan College is offering 26 of its most popular courses with most classes to start September 14 & 16 at Bishop Reding Secondary School. More info: www.sheridaninstitute.ca.
