The show will be held in the Georgetown Library and Cultural Center located at 9 Church Street in Georgetown. Admission is free.

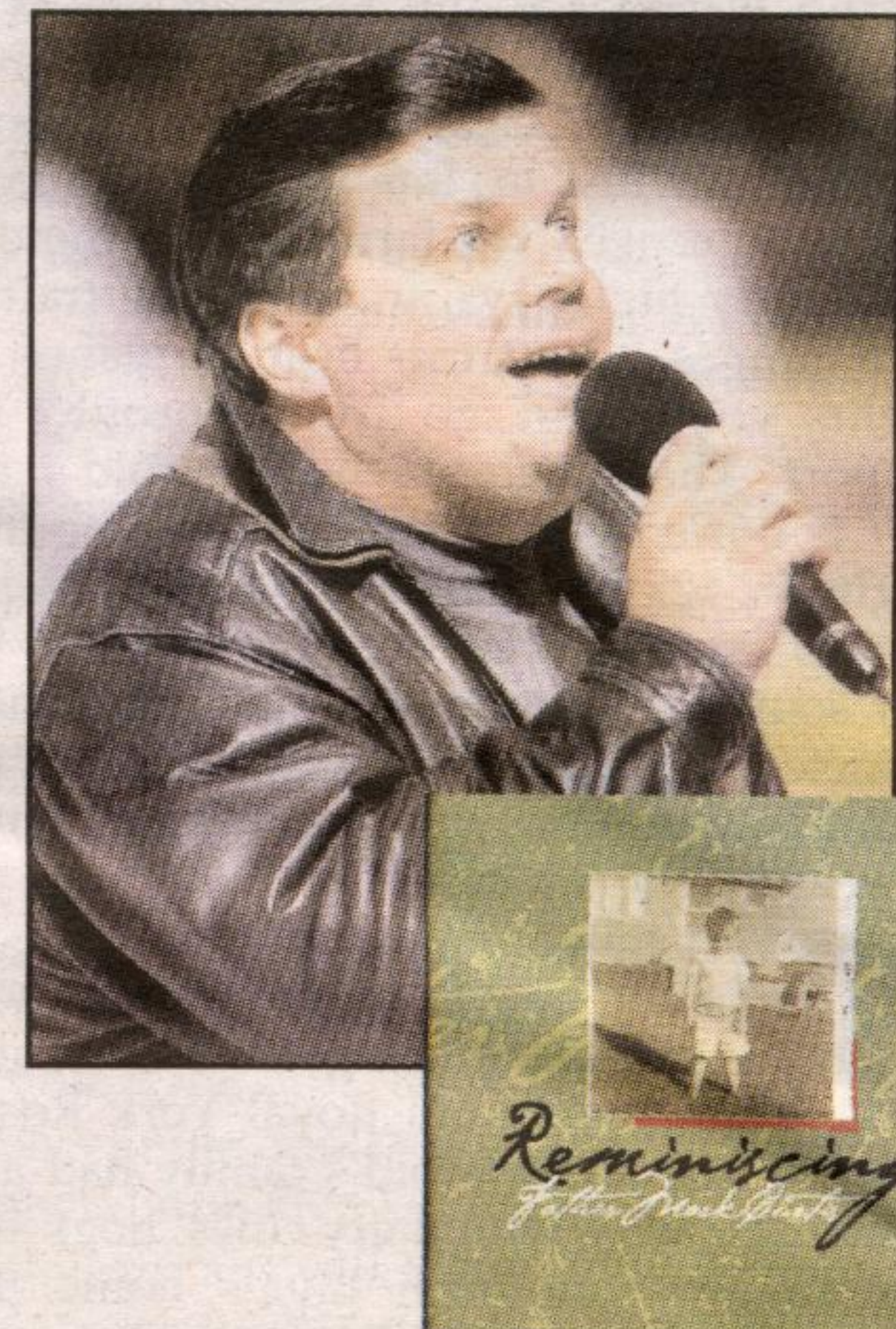
Father Mark Curtis celebrates 30th anniversary with the Release of a New Recording, *Reminiscing at Special Concert*
