live years after the box office hit The Princess Diaries, Anne Hathaway returns as the sensational royal Princess Mia of Genovia. Transformed from geek to gorgeous in the first film, Mia is now done college and close to being ready to assume her position on the throne. Now that she is twenty-one, the custom of the country is for the old Queen, played by Julie Andrews, to step down and allow the next in line to be instated. As with any good fairy tale, the evil Viscount Mabrey (Jonathan Rhys-Davies) wishes for his own part of the royal action and decrees that his nephew is the rightful heir. Mabrey reminds Genovian parliament that their law clearly states the princess shall be married before taking the throne. In an age of gender equality and women's rights, Mia surprisingly tries to abide by this rule in her designated thirty-day time limit resulting in some hilarious antics and realistic depictions of the paparazzi.

Although I had originally thought this film would be one of those great all ages Disney productions, The Princess Diaries 2 caters mainly to the ten and under age group who still have the naiveté to wish upon a star and hope to marry a handsome prince someday. With the exception of Julie Andrews' miraculously well-sung "Your Crowning Glory", (a miraculous feat after her botched throat surgery in 1997), the film unfortunately doesn't manage to incorporate many adult jokes or references to keep the adults awake. While I'm sure my seven year-old cousin would enjoy the many perks that Garry Marshall associates with being a princess, I would argue this film is merely a modern non-cartoon version of Cinderella that seeks to emphasize the colossal dream Disney has instilled in all girls, that everyone can indeed be a princess if you just have enough jewels and 'really believe you can'.

#### Man on Fire


