Presbyterian Church in Campbellville. And then there's the charity yard sale, held twice a year - in June and September — at the home of Cory and Christina Opsteen on the Campbellville Sideroad.

"WE CAN'T BE TAKING ALL THE TIME"

Jane started volunteering at the charity yard sale about two to three years ago, and she keeps coming back because of the nice people she's met. Helping out at the Opsteens gives her another chance to do something for her community. "I am at a time in my life where it is time to give back to the community. We can't be taking all the time."

On the weekend of September 11 and 12, the Opsteens held their 15th charity yard sale in support of Independent Living Halton, a charitable non-profit organization that supports physically challenged adults. Mrs. Opsteen says the yard sale began in 1995 and since that time up until the 14th sale, they've raised \$16,829 in support of Independent Living Halton.

All proceeds from the event are directed to the non-profit organization which has offices in Milton. Pearl Eirich, who has been a volunteer with Independent Living Halton since its beginnings in 1991, says the organization operates a home in Milton that provides 24-hour attendant care for physically disabled people in Halton. The group also provides attendant care in the home or in the classroom for the physically disabled.

As neighbours, the Opsteens and Mrs. Eirich

decided to team up to raise money for Independent Living Halton by starting a charity yard sale in the 1990s. At their first sale, they raised \$350. That first fundraiser for Independent Living Halton was on a much smaller scale, but the event has grown a lot since then. At first, it was held once a year. Then they decided to hold two yard sales annually.

The Opsteens say that donations of yard sale items can be made year round. They have sufficient storage space on their property to keep items for the sale. If you have anything that you would like to donate, contact the Opsteens at 905-878-3988.




Fall Compost Give Away

Bring your reusable clothing and household items to the Salvation Army Depot at Halton's Waste Management Site.


