

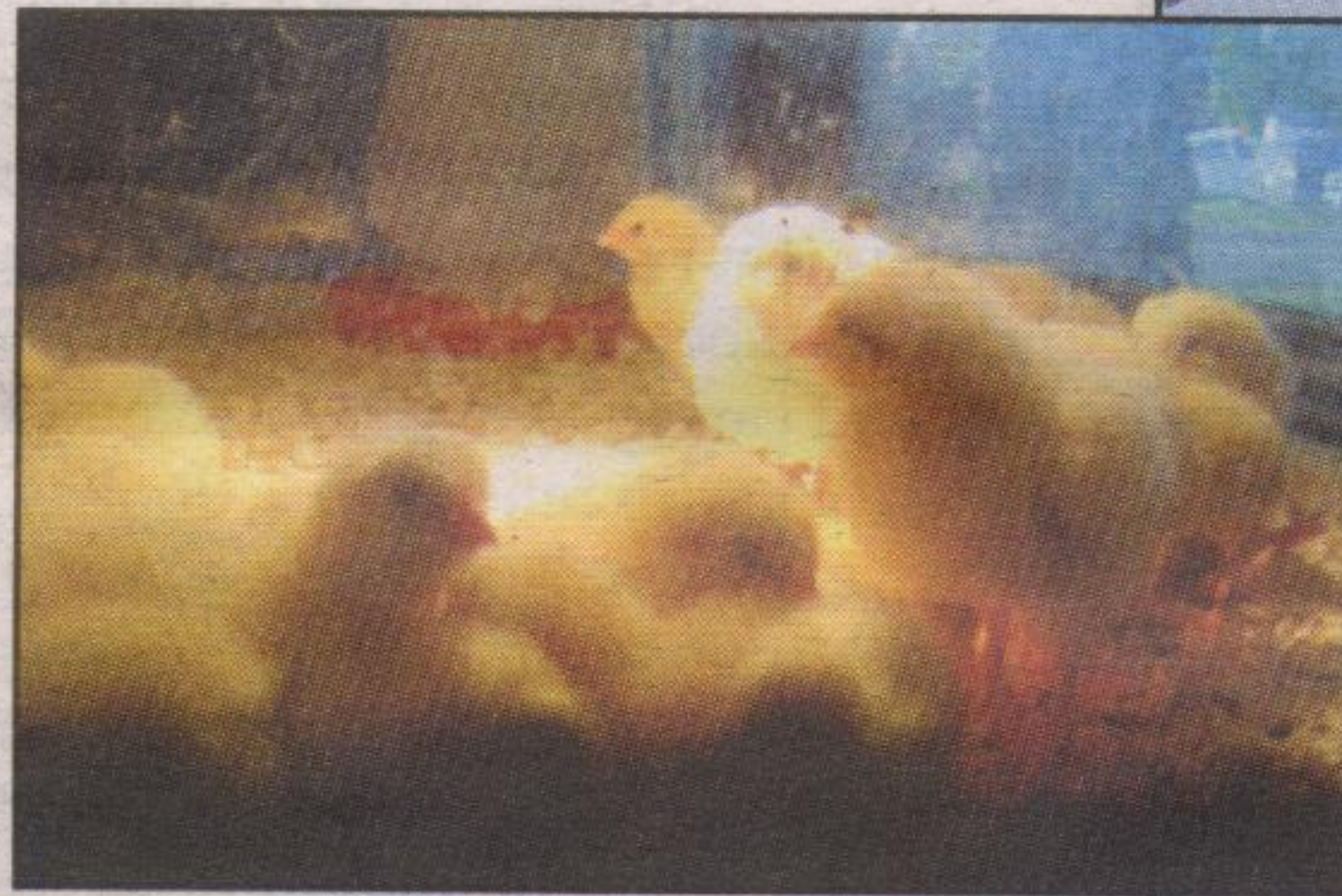


# Dairy Days at the

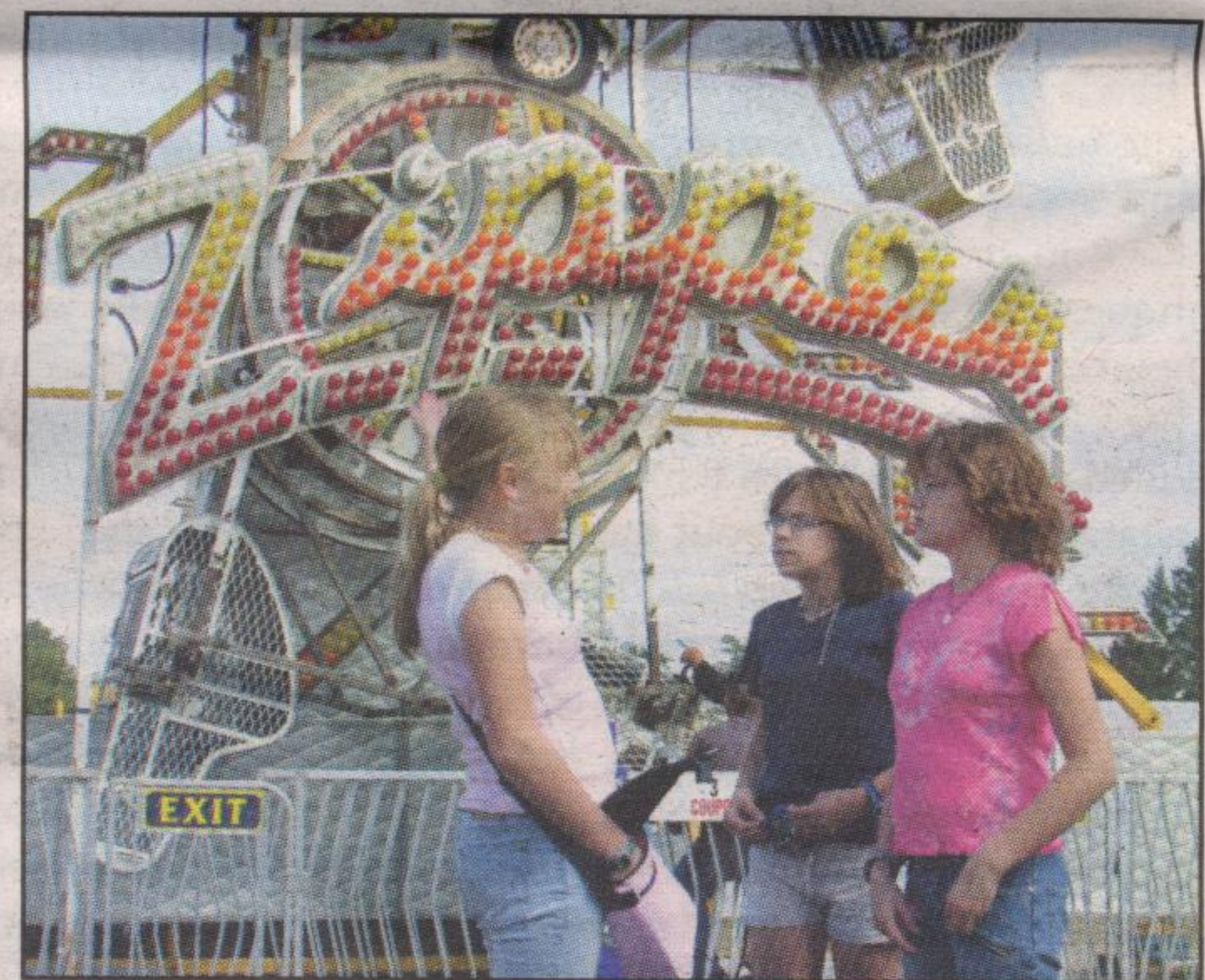
