Literacy is a grown up thing

Garden Harmony Concert and Art Show in Georgetown

Georgetown residents gathered to enjoy music and artwork at the Garden Harmony Concert and Art Show last Saturday at the Old Dominion Seed Gardens Site. Presented by Literacy North Halton, the free outdoor concert promoted local talent while raising awareness and funds toward its adult literacy program.

Sharon Foster, Literacy North Halton's marketing co-ordinator, said the concert was good for everyone. "We're happy to be able to promote local talent and at the same time let people know what we do."

Groups including the Georgetown Bach Chorale and Georgetown Globe Productions performed for the crowd while local artists such as Jan Zimmerman and Herta Hajek displayed their paintings.

Literacy North Halton offers one-on-one tutoring lessons in reading, math and basic computer skills to adults in North Halton. Started 17 years ago, the non-profit organization was originally run by a small group of volunteers out of their homes. It now has over 100 volunteers includ-

ing tutors who must complete a training session before they begin working with students. Tutors must be available to teach three hours a week for a minimum of six months. "It's a big commitment," said Foster.

Foster said it's important the public knows services provided by Literacy North Halton are confidential. "We're always looking for students," said Foster, "but some people are ashamed or embarrassed." Most students at Literacy North Halton have a reading level between grades three and six.

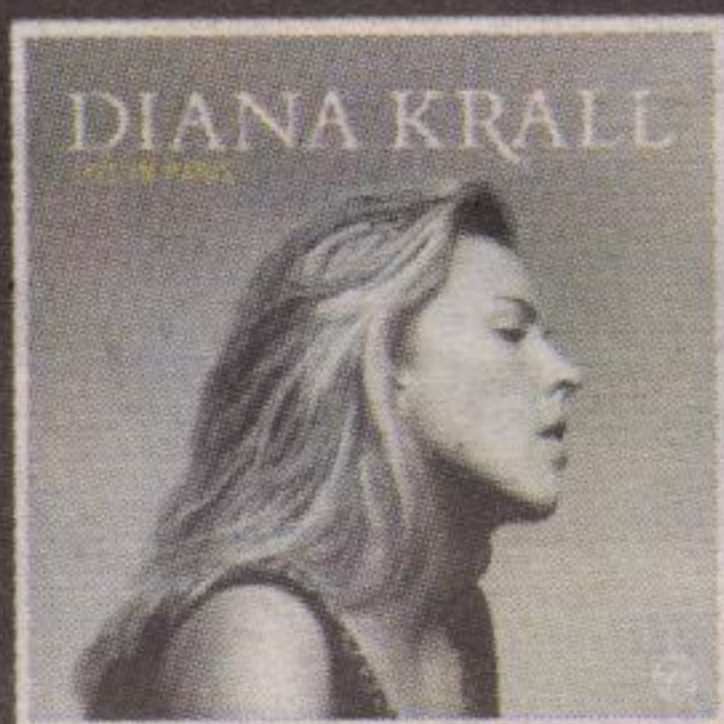
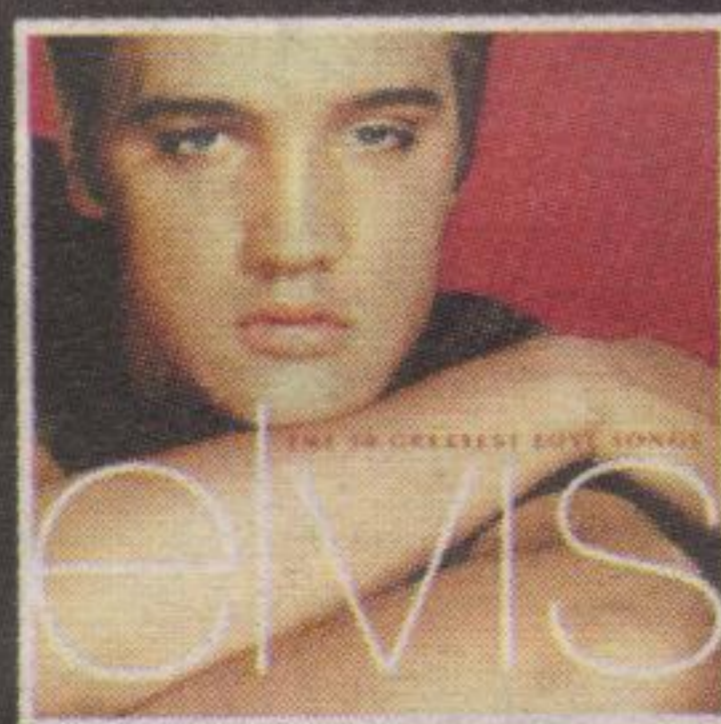
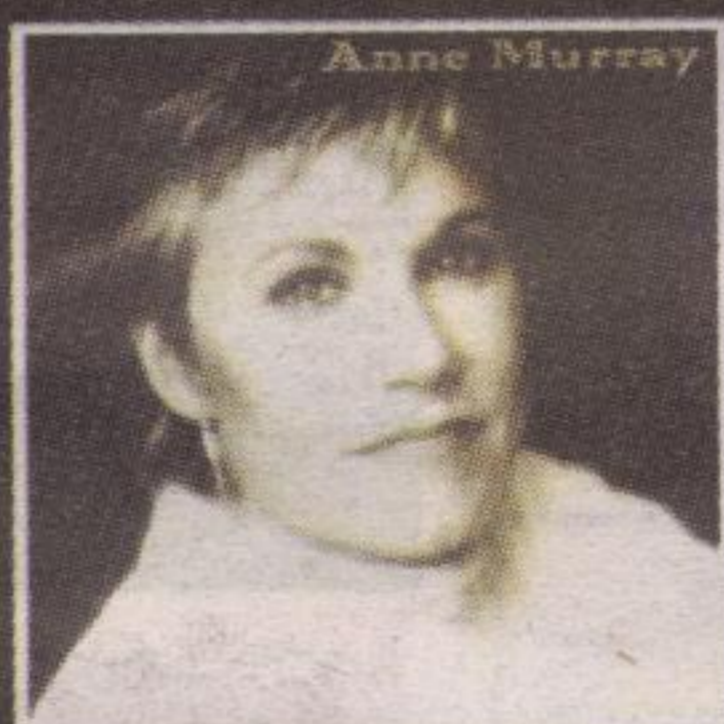
