

## Rural forum on policing

#### Savoline and Algar seek public input

A region comprised of four separate municipalities, two urban and two rural, Halton must be sensitive to the fact that on no issue will there be a one-size-fits-all solution. Whether the issue is housing; education; health care; roads or infrastructure, each municipality brings with it a unique set of circumstances.

With this in mind, Halton Regional Chairman Joyce Savoline and Halton Regional Police Chief Ean Algar want to talk to the residents of Halton's two rural municipalities, Milton and Halton Hills, to find out what their particular needs are in relation to policing. The public is invited to a rural community forum on Tuesday, October 12 at Halton Region Museum at 6 pm. This rural community forum is part of the Region's continued effort to increase communications with residents living in North Halton and will focus on issues such as communications, security, speeding, illegal parking, traffic and road maintenance. Chairman Savoline and Police Chief Algar will both be present for the meeting to receive input from residents and to answer questions.

"The Halton Regional Police Service is committed to community policing," explained Chief Algar. "Community involvement and input will help us to continue achieving excellent results in lowering crime rates in Halton." Regional Chairman Joyce Savoline expanded on this message, saying "Halton Region is committed to the open flow of communication between government and the community. Public consultations assist us in meeting this commitment by allowing us to hear from our residents about the issues meaningful to them."
