### NOTICE OF FILING OF ENVIRONMENTAL STUDY REPORT

#### Dundas Street (Regional Road 5) Improvements Oak Park Boulevard to east of Highway 403 Town of Oakville Class Environmental Assessment Study

The Regional Municipality of Halton has carried out a Class Environmental Assessment to address future travel demands on Dundas Street from Oak Park Boulevard to east of Highway 403 (refer to map below). The study was conducted in compliance with Schedule C of the Municipal Class Environment Assessment (June 2000), which is approved under the Ontario Environmental Assessment Act.

Following the April 15, 2004 Public Information Centre, the preferred alternative was reviewed in light of comments received and modified. Taking into consideration the comments that were received from the Town of Oakville, regulatory agencies and the public, the recommended alternative includes (see map below):

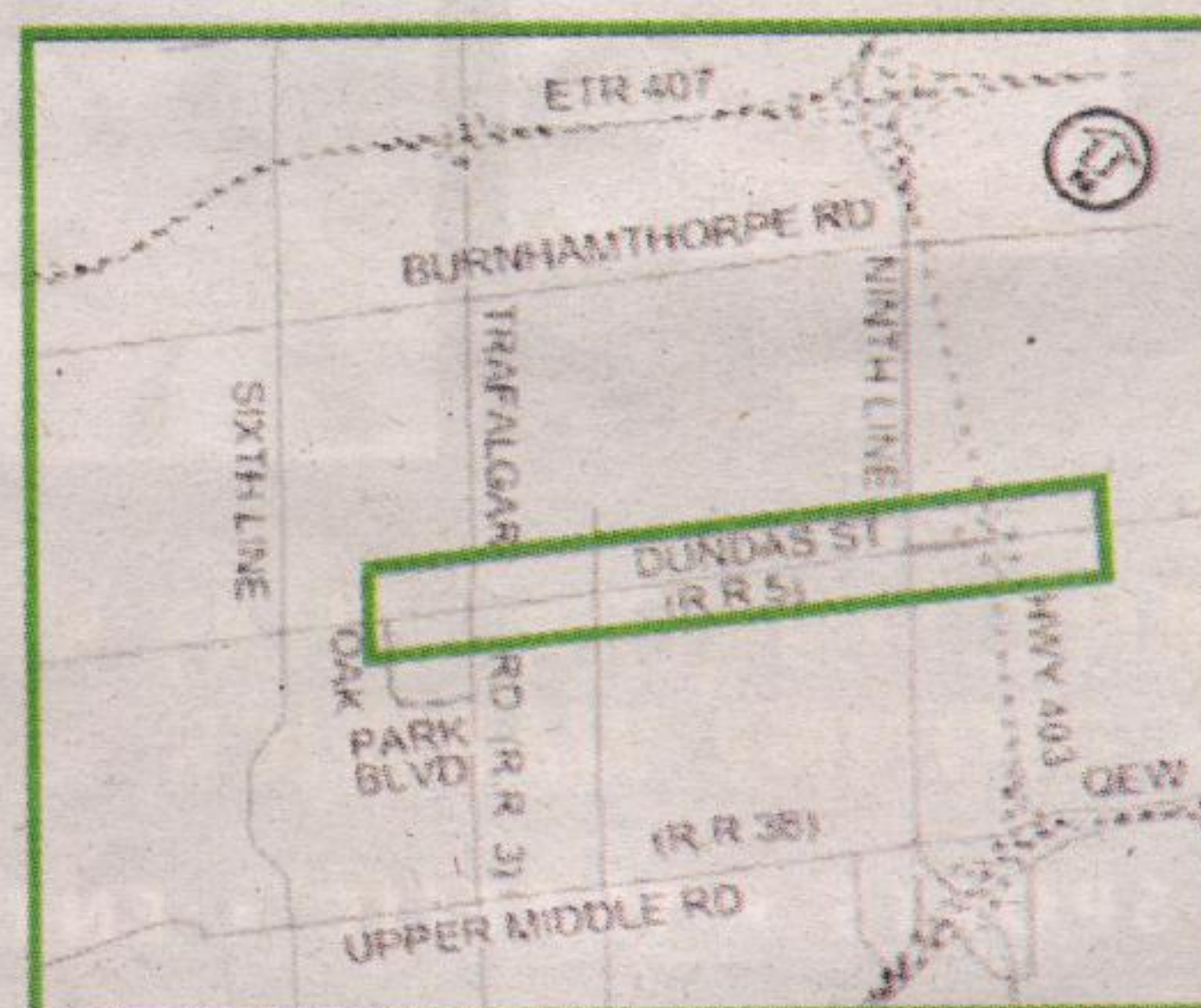
- the widening of Dundas Street (Regional Road 5) to six lanes (two of which will function as High Occupancy Vehicle Lanes during the peak periods) from west of Oak Park Boulevard to east of Highway 403 with a centre-raised median within a proposed 47 m right-of-way,
- the widening of Trafalgar Road (Regional Road 3) to six lanes in the vicinity of the Dundas Street intersection from Hays Boulevard to approximately 150 m north of Dundas Street.

The Environmental Study Report (ESR) has been prepared to document the planning and decision making processes that were followed. By this Notice, the ESR is being placed on the public record for a 30-day review period in accordance with the requirements of the Municipal Class EA. Subject to comments received as a result of this Notice and the receipt of necessary approvals, Halton Region intends to proceed with the detail design and construction as documented in the ESR.

If concerns regarding this project cannot be resolved in discussion with Halton Region, a person or party may request that the Minister of Environment make an order for the project to comply with Part II of the Environmental Assessment Act (referred to as a Part II Order). Requests for Part II Order must be received by the Minister, at the address below by Monday, November 8, 2004. A copy of the request must also be sent to the Region's Project Manager. If no request is received by Monday, November 8, 2004, Halton Region intends to proceed with detailed design and construction as outlined in the ESR.

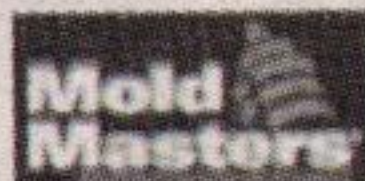
