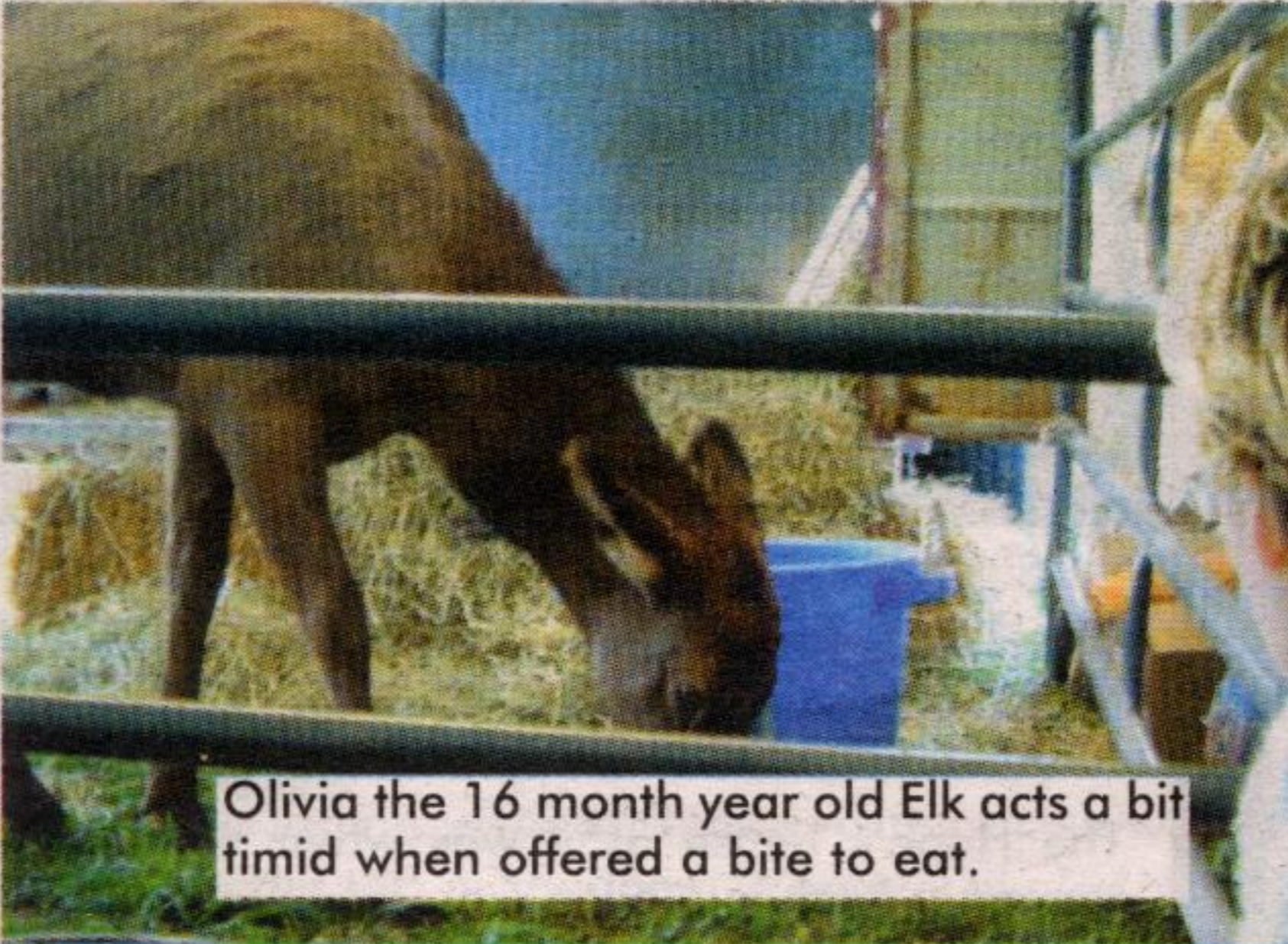


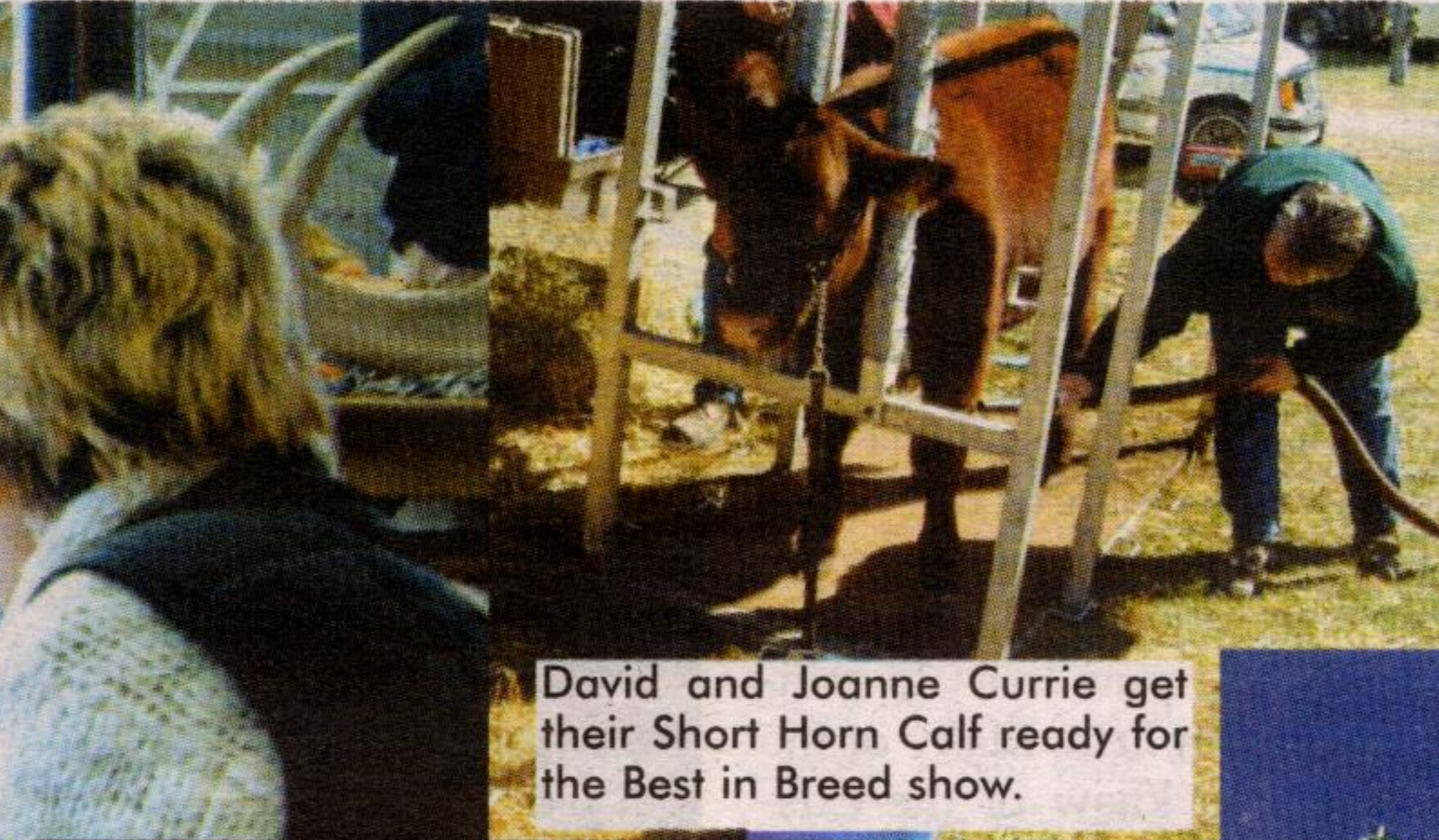
Experience the charm of Erin Fall Fair

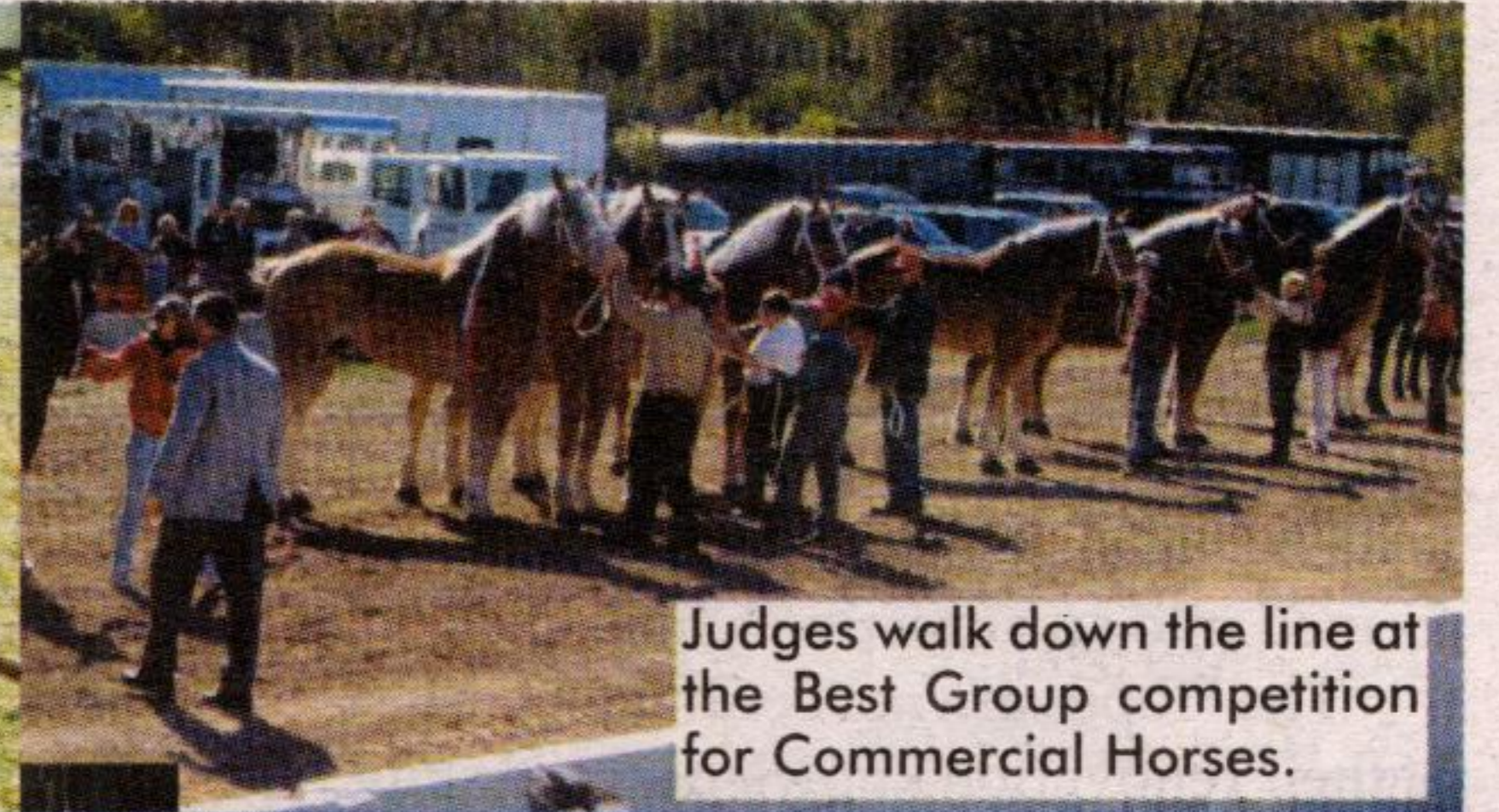

Judges walk down the line at the Best Group competition for Commercial Horses.



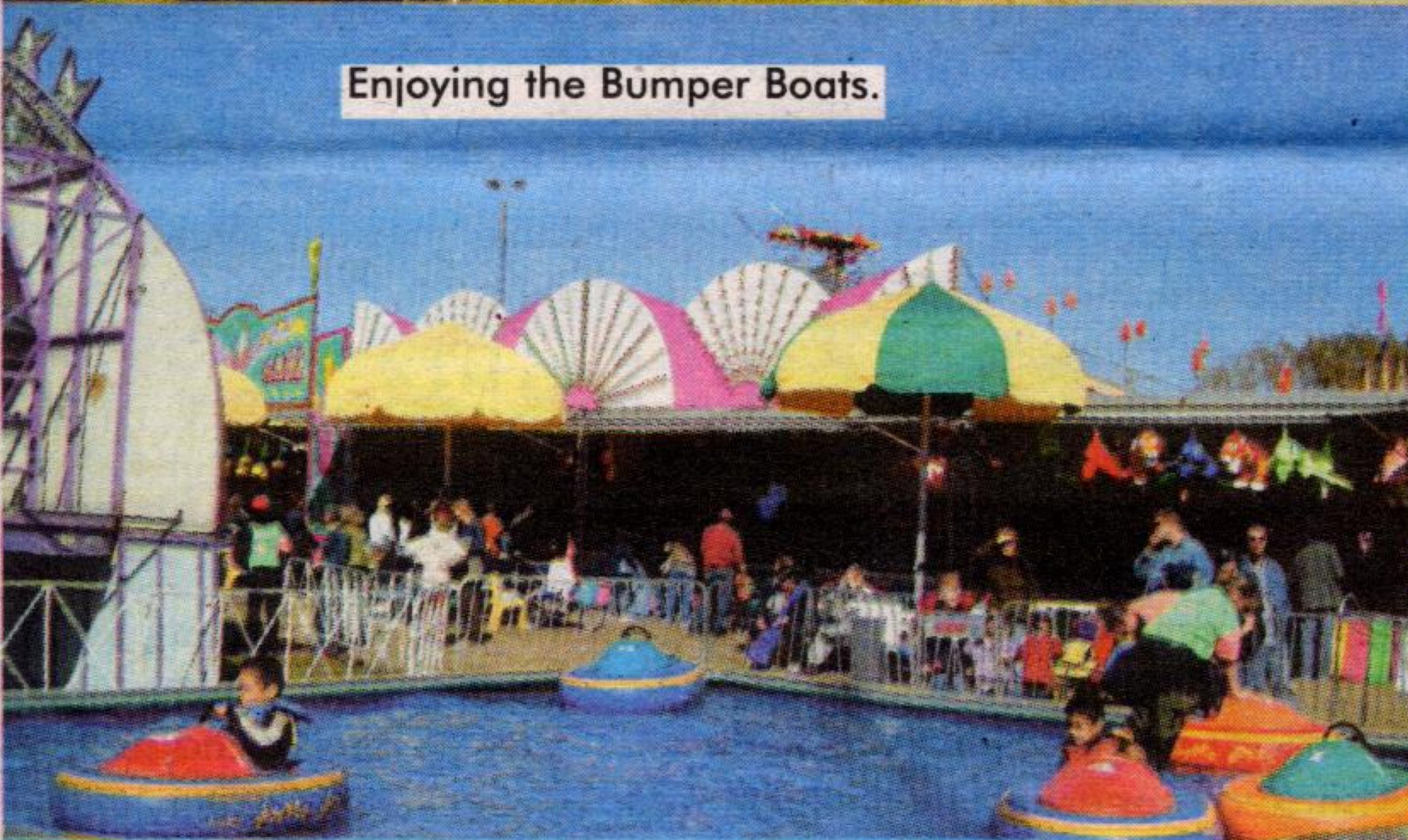
The Scrambler, another ride attraction at the Fair.



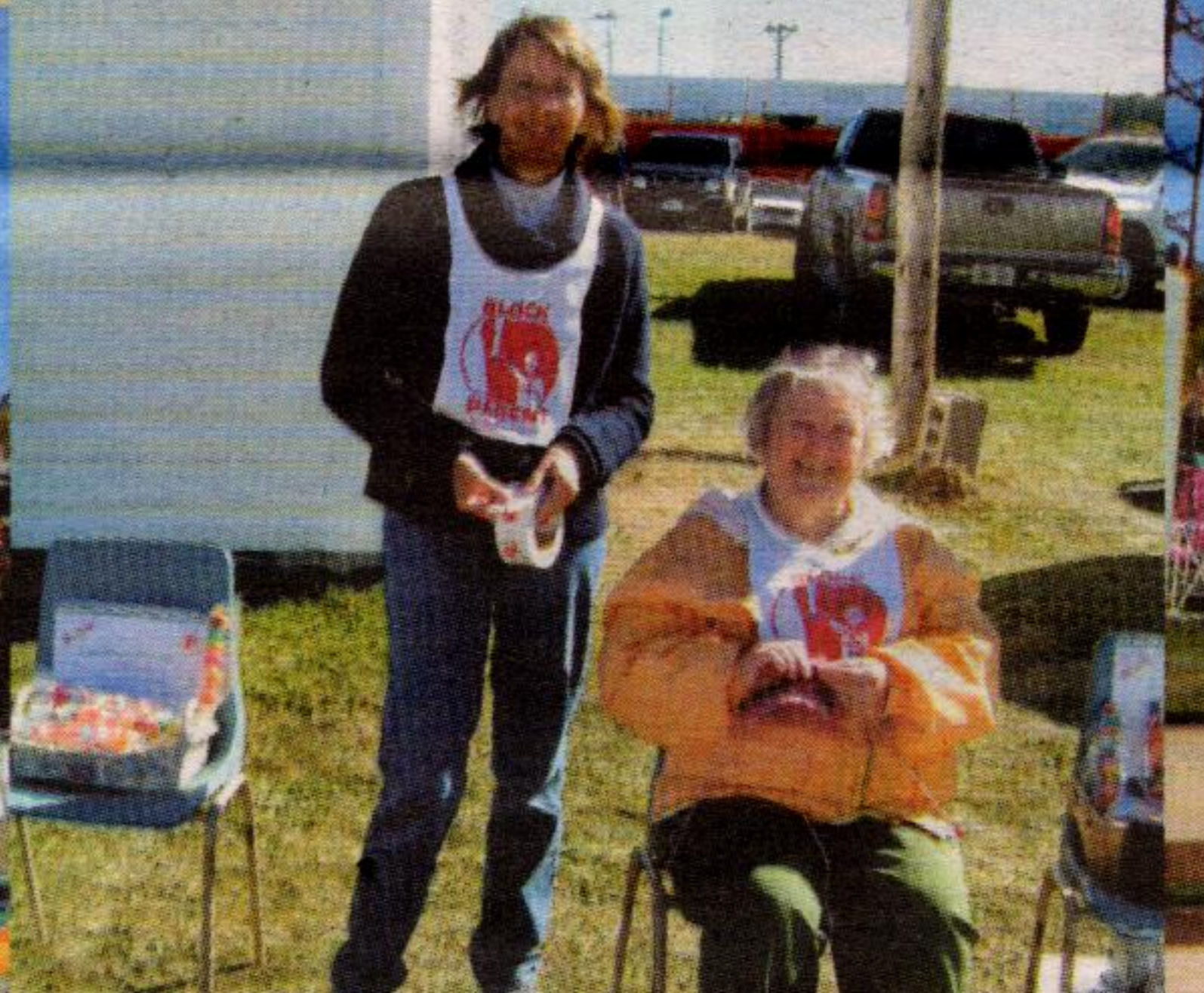
Sunday's Entertainment at 12:30 was performed by The Country Store Band.



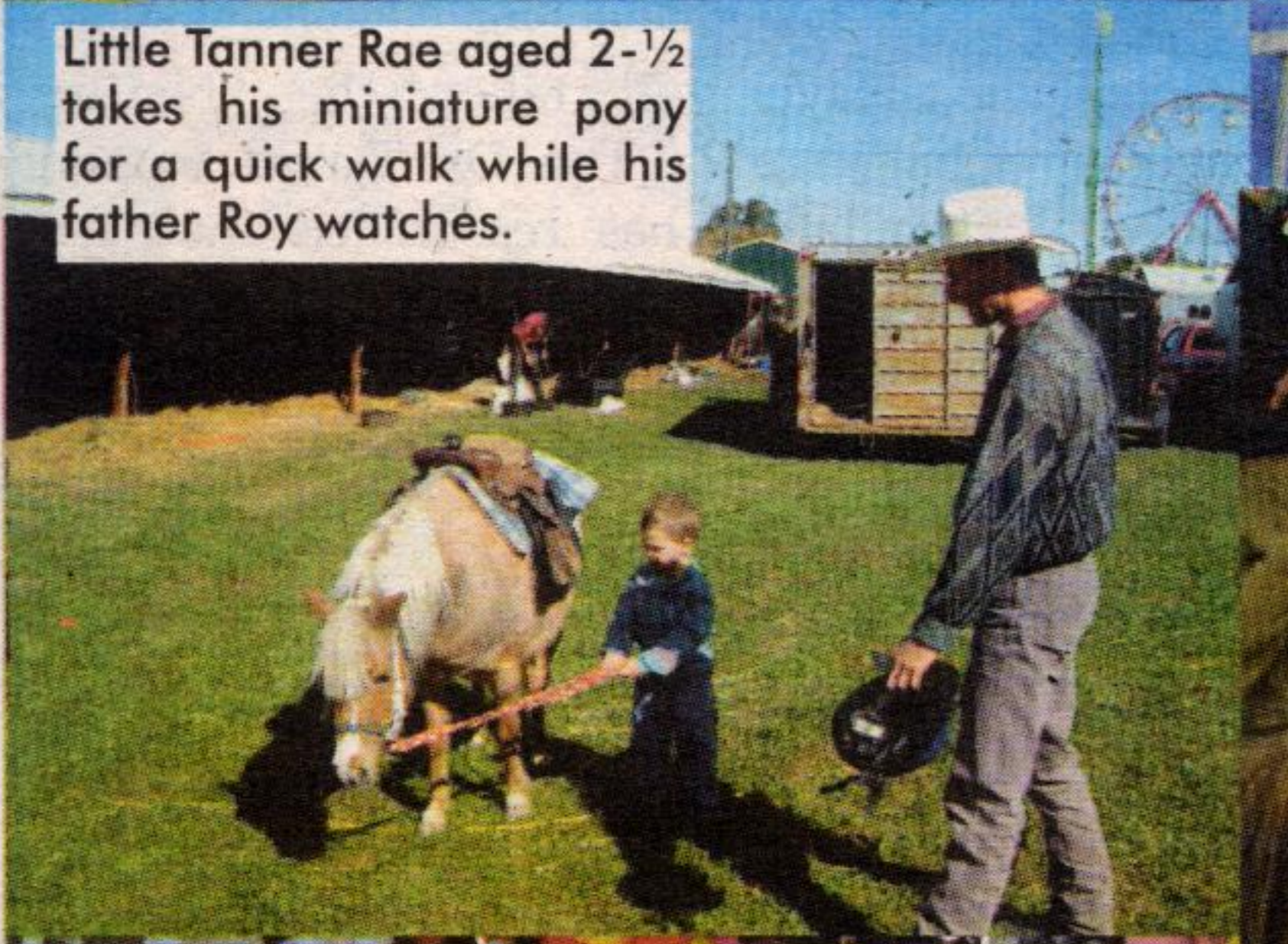
The most attractive ride, The Ferris Wheel, gleams in the afternoon's sun.

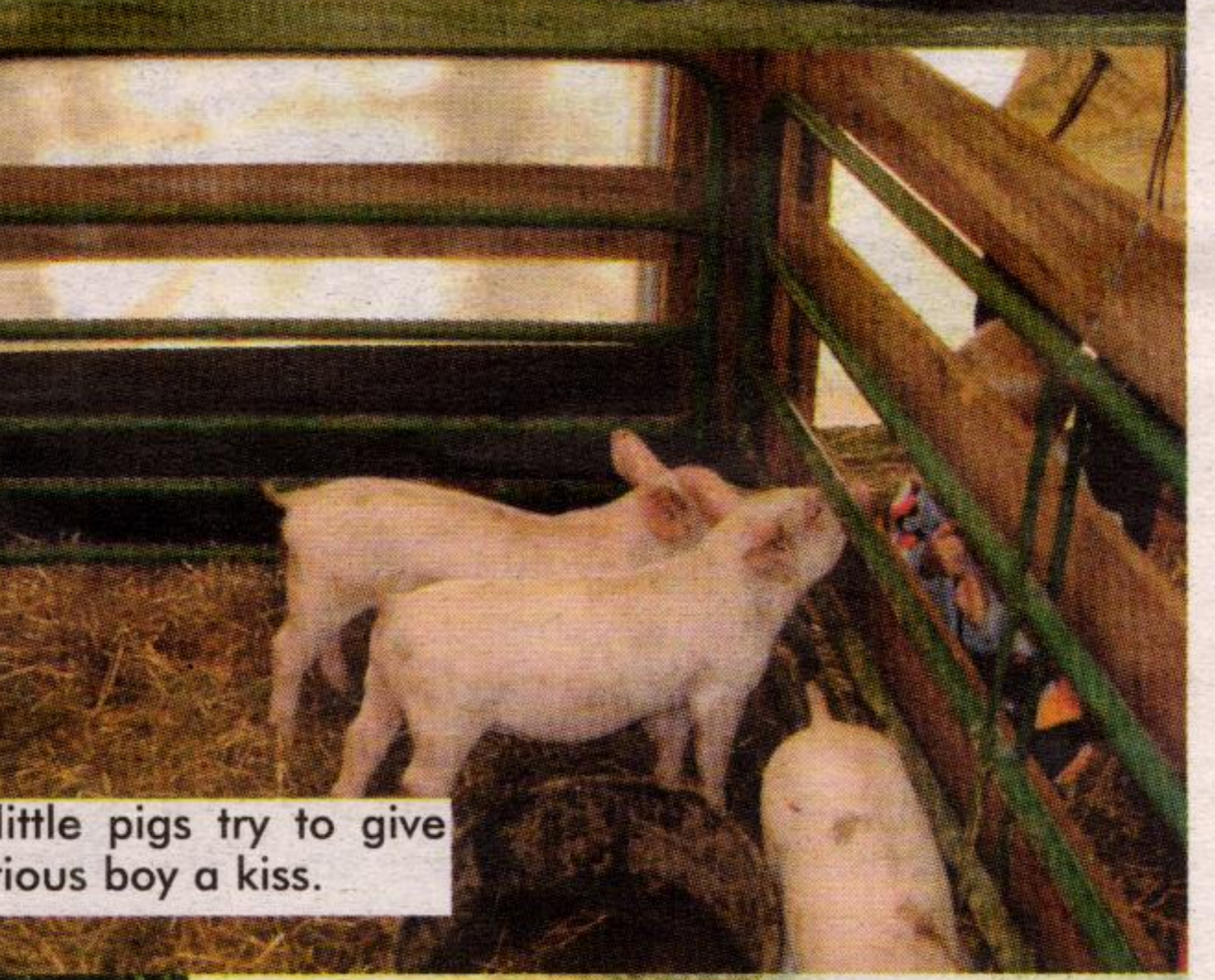
Always there to help, block parents Carol Pollock and Mary Porter volunteer their time at the lost and found station.



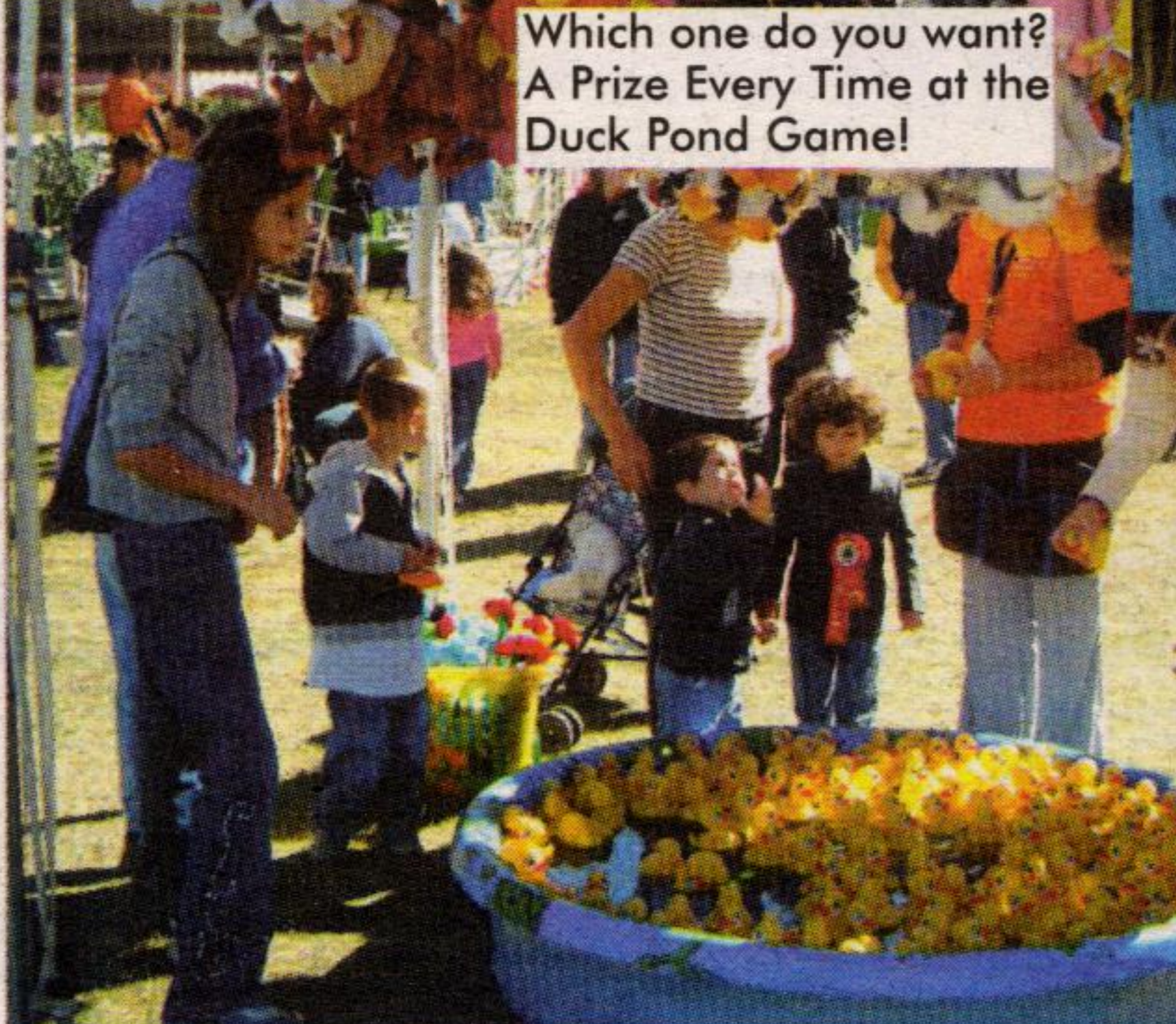
Little Tanner Rae aged 2-1/2 takes his miniature pony for a quick walk while his father Roy watches.



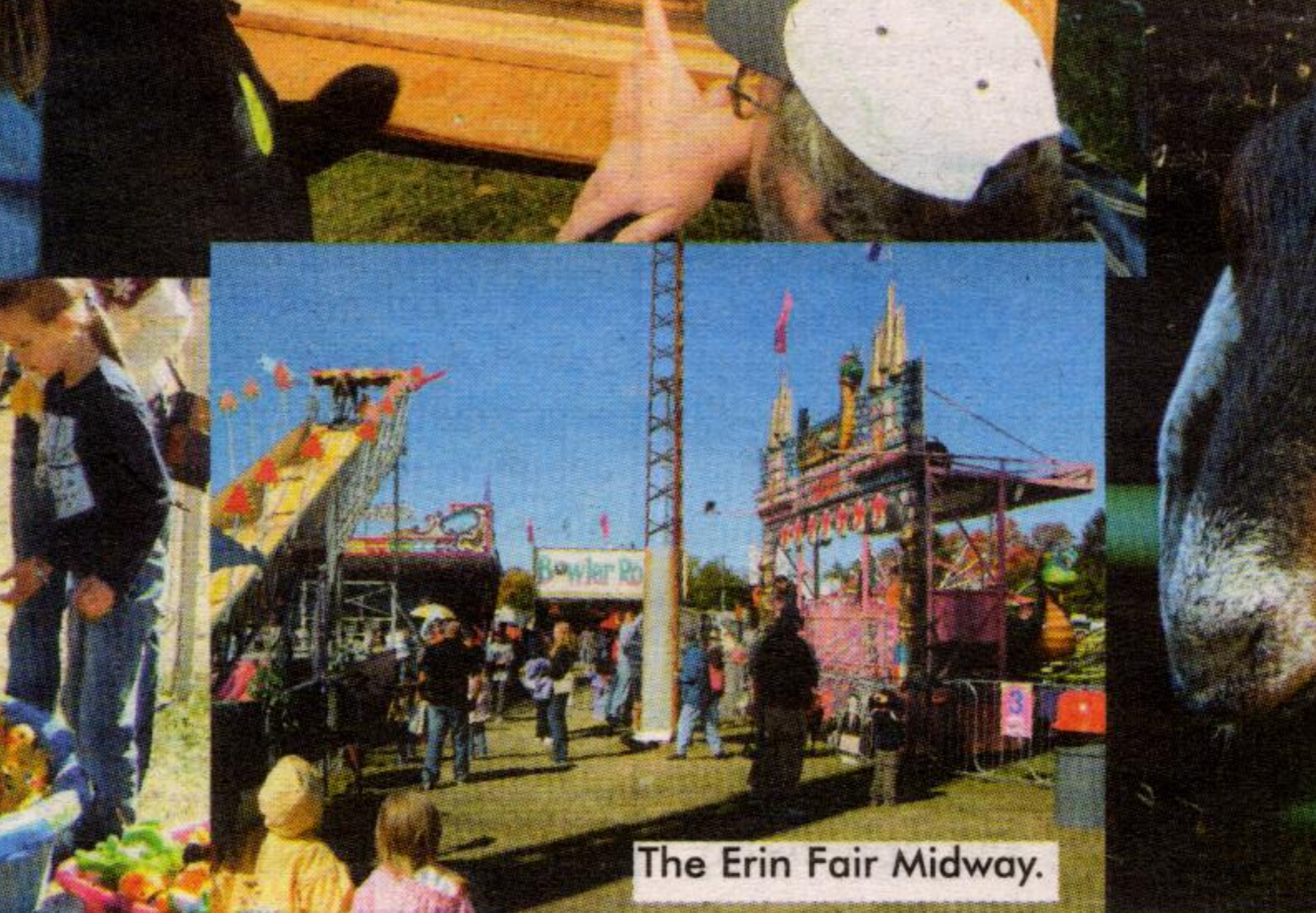
Bee Farmer Peter Sinnott from Honeywood demonstrates how his hive of Italian Honey Bee's swarm together to stay warm.



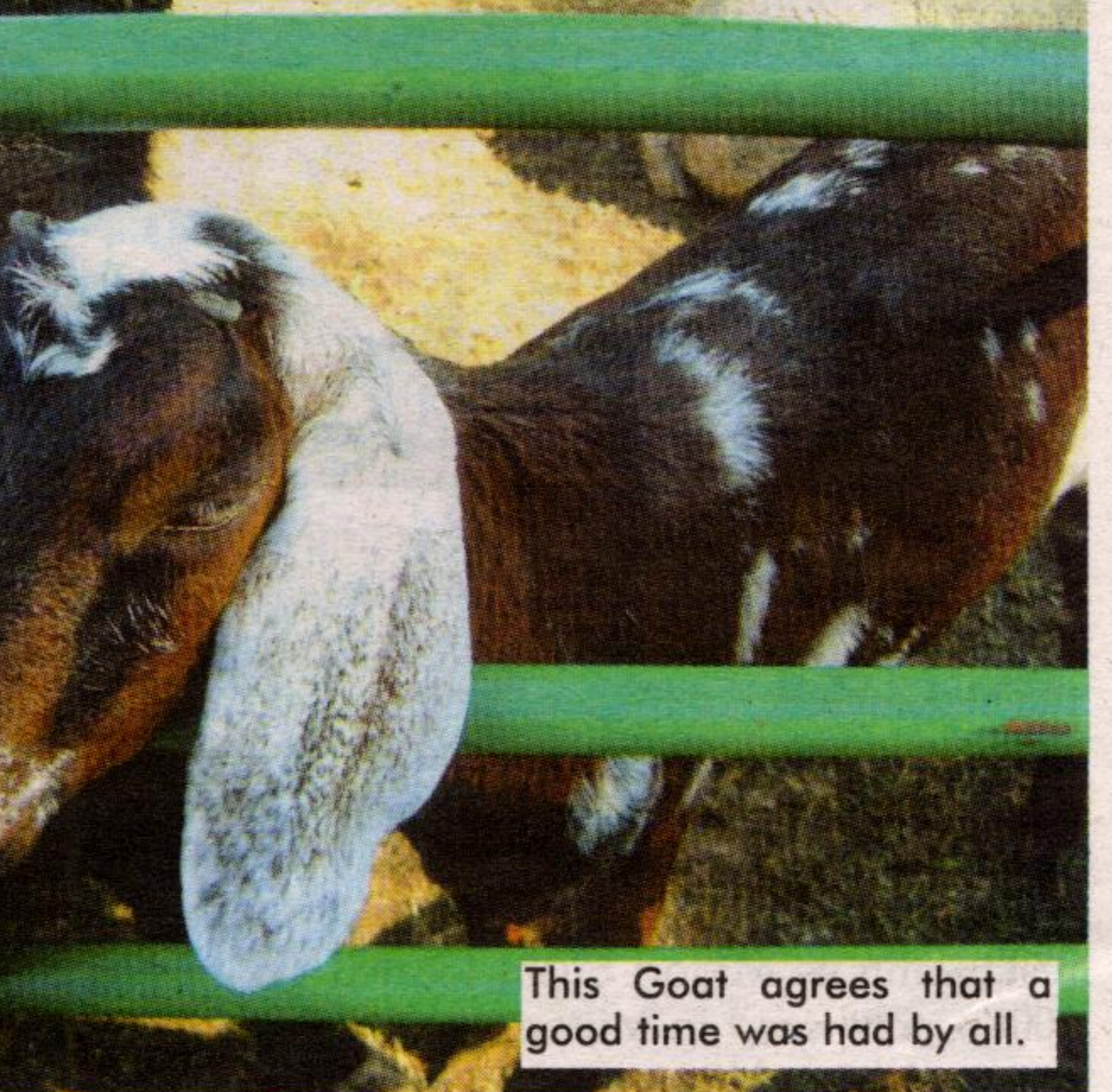
Three little pigs try to give this curious boy a kiss.
