The pub boasts a traditional English décor, a variety of delicious meals, imported ales and lagers, and tasty teas served in individual pots dressed with tea cozies. The Copper






Kettle also features musical jam nights every other Tuesday evening.

Best's Harbour, just across the road from the pub has an extensive collection of Canadian art and crafts. The building (circa 1847) was actually the setting for Timothy Eaton's first job.

Don't leave the village without a visit to the Glen Oven Bakery, where you can enjoy a great cup of tea or coffee along with a large selection of baked goodies.






