opening of its' new model home for the "Classics of Deer Ridge Estates" project in Kitchener. This new model offers a 3,500-square-foot layout - with a master bedroom on the main floor, and three bedrooms upstairs. There's a 14'x17' dining room, a main floor study, an 8'x9' shower in the ensuite bathroom, and a trendy "family studio" - a multi-purpose flex space, which sits off the kitchen, has access to the garage, and is laundry compatible.

Starting at \$309,990, these custom homes come in two-storey and, bungalow designs, set on expansive 60-foot and 70-foot frontages. These homes adjoin both the Deer Ridge Golf & Country Club, and the scenic Grand River Valley. And each carries its' own unique front elevation.

Meanwhile, the Mill Run project - set in the rolling hills of Rockwood, just north of Milton - is comprised of 160 bungalow, and two-storey homes with 50-foot frontages, and back yards at least 115 feet deep, starting at \$280,000. Mill Run is a planned community that offers small town living with the convenience of urban amenities in surrounding communities such as Guelph, Milton and Georgetown.

Raised in Wellington County himself, Kuiken takes pride in referring to Charleston Homes as being, "more like a small-town builder". He actively supports charities including Friends of the Orphans Canada, which builds orphanages in third world countries with a current orphanage being built in Chimaltenango, Guatemala; as well as assisting in Habitat for Humanity projects like the recent build in Acton, Ontario.

"I always get a lot of satisfaction when we build a home for people, and we're about to turn it over. To me, it's a great honour. Our clients are entrusting us with a lot of their equity," he says.

"A lot of my customers I will see at the grocery store, or the restaurant. It's very important to me, that I don't have to cross the street."
