## NOTICE OF COMMENCEMENT

### Class Environmental Assessment **Sherwood Survey Wastewater Pump Station** Town of Milton, Regional Municipality of Halton

In March 2003 the Regional Municipality of Halton completed a Water and Wastewater Master Plan Review which identified infrastructure required to service future growth in Halton. One of the projects identified in the Master Plan Review was the construction of a wastewater pump station required to service lands in the Sherwood Survey community in the Town of Milton.

This Pump Station is a "Schedule B" project in accordance with the Municipal Engineers Association MEA) Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (June 2000). The Master Plan Review completed Phase 1 and a portion of Phase 2 of the Class EA planning and design process. This notice signals Halton's intention to complete Phase 2 (Alternative Solutions) of the MEA Municipal Class EA process as required for "Schedule B" projects.

A key component of the Class EA involves the presentation of the evaluation process to interested stakeholders (public and regulatory agencies) as it progresses and to provide stakeholders with an opportunity to review the project scope and to address issues related to the project including alternative solutions, environmental considerations and evaluation criteria.





# Man and Superman

hristopher Reeve, the actor, Superman, the equestrian, died October 10th. 2004. As an actor and a man, he embodied strength and athleticism and performed his own movie stunts. "Look, I've flown, I've become evil, loved, stopped and turned the world backwards, I've faced my peers, I've befriended children and small ani- tentious, controversial and reaction to mals and I have rescued cats from trees," Reeve told the Los Angeles Times in 1983 just before the release of his third superman movie.

But real life, gave him the best opportunity to shed the cape and show extraordinary human powers. Reeve suffered the most severe spinal injuries possible when he was thrown from his mount and broke his neck when his horse refused a jump during an equestrian competition in May 1995.

Reeve, had contemplated suicide but decided to devote his time to becoming his own guinea pig as he searched for ways to become mobile. The equestrian industry salutes the man of steel.

Richard Gere has been blasted for making insensitive comments about horse riding in the wake of Christopher Reeve's death. Gere wore a cast after breaking his arm in a horse riding accident and joked that "men are not thrown off horses" on the U.S. talk show Live with Regis and Kelly. The comments were seen as tactless by many in light of Reeve's horrific horse riding accident nine years ago.

A concerned member of the public alerted the Ontario SPCA to a farm near Aurora in York Region. The SPCA discovered two Thoroughbred geldings and a Welsh pony in desperate

need of water and food. Unfortunately one Thoroughbred with low blood pressure and minimal body temperature had to be euthanized. Charges will be brought against the owner.
