Most train-motor vehicle collisions happen in the daytime and when the train is travelling less than 80 km/h. Some drivers believe that they can "beat the train" but the average freight train, which weighs between sixteen thousand and twenty thousand tonnes, when travelling at 120 km/h requires more than 1.5 kilometres to stop. An eight-car passenger train travelling at 59 km/h requires about one kilometre to stop. Even if the locomotive engineer sees you and applies the emergency brakes, the distance required to stop is the equivalent of almost fourteen football fields. And even if you race to a tie, you
