Regional Road 25 Improvements Towns of Oakville and Milton Class Environmental Assessment Study

The Regional Municipality of Halton is undertaking a Class Environmental Assessment to consider improvements to Regional Road 25, from Highway 407 northerly to Derry Road (Regional Road 7). Public Information Centre No. 1 was held on Thursday, March 11, 2004, at which time the need for improvements was summarized, and planning alternatives were assessed. Based on input received, as well as on an assessment by the study team, Halton Region has determined that the preferred solution is the widening of Regional Road 25 from two lanes to four lanes, together with traffic control improvements.

The study team has completed an in-depth review of environmental conditions and is developing and assessing various design alternatives. The study is being conducted in compliance with Schedule "C" of the Municipal Engineers Association "Municipal Class Environmental Assessment," (June 2000).

A Public Information Centre (PIC) is planned, to provide further information to the public and to receive input and feedback on the study to date. The PIC is to be held as follows:




