ased on The book Skipping Christmas by John Grisham, Christmas With The Kranks takes



audiences through the journey of empty nest syndrome gone wrong. After twenty-three years of family Christmases their daughter, Blair, has enrolled in the Peace Corps and won't be able to make it to this year's festivities. Instead of participating in anything to do with Christmas this year, the Kranks have decided to save their money and take a Caribbean Cruise. Much to their neighbors dismay, the Kranks boycott on Christmas disrupts the famous neighbourhood light decorating contest, causes upset with various fundraisers and leads the street of merry makers into a full out attack on the Krank household to free Frosty, the six foot plastic snowman.

Under the direction of Joe Roth, the film takes a satirical kick at society's need to conform to Christmas and its many expectations. When no one in the neighbourhood understands the Kranks' need to skip Christmas, the humour in the situation becomes all too familiar to anyone living under the coercion of a close-knit community. Luther and Nora (played by Tim Allen and Jamie Lee Curtis) spend the first half of the film avoiding neighbors and the pressures of retail America during the holidays. Hilarious scenes, such as the couple's trip to the tanning salon, are perfect demonstrations of traditional Commedia Dell'arte or Italian comedy. One specific aspect of this type of drama is slapstick comedy, which relies mainly on physical humour. By incorporating slapstick comedy into the film, the focus lies on the execution of the scenes rather than the actual content. When the couple receives a surprise phone call from their daughter Blair, who has decided to return from the Peace Corps for Christmas, the slapstick comedy shines through in the couple's scramble to prepare a party on moments notice.

Running only an hour and thirty four minutes, audiences won't get sick of this comedic story line that only gets sillier as the story progresses. When the Kranks' daughter Blair eventually does return home Christmas Eve, the climax of the film comes right at the ending when the neighbourhood decides to pull together in an effort to preserve her Christmas cheer. Rated PG-13 for the film's brief language slips and subtle suggestive comments, this film is suitable for any family seeking a holiday laugh this festive season.

The concert will feature Christmas well-known music such as Have Yourself a Merry Little Christmas as well as lesser known works, including some performances of African

Christmas music. Established in 1996, the group entertains audiences in Halton each year and they usually perform two concerts, one at Christmas and another in the spring. Ms. Jeffrey says the group always tries to feature guest artists drawn from "the pool of extraordinary talent living in and around Milton." She says that her group's concerts have "presented wonderful veteran performers, as well as gifted young musicians."

The Women of Note also sing for many local groups and organizations.
