

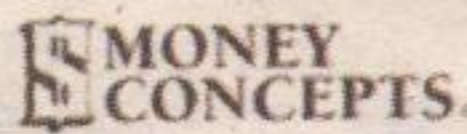

Robert Lowrie, a resident of Roxburgh Terrace and a shoemaker by trade, and Innes, daughter of the Reverend David Hunter, were married at the Church of St. Cuthbert's, Edinburgh on the twelfth day of March, 1832 by the Reverend David Hunter and in 1844, Robert and 'Inez' purchased the east half of Lot 11, Conc. 2, Nassagaweya Township. The eldest son John married Elizabeth Hunter and they farmed on the east half of Lot 13, Conc. 2. John was a bachelor and also moved west. Daughter Catherine married Charles McPhail. Catherine and Charles had a son, James, never married and died in his 26th year. Son Robert married Rachel Hunter, sister to Elizabeth Hunter, raised three children. Their daughter Innes married John William Mahon. He died at age 40 in 1911 and Innes lived with her father Robert on fifty acres of the east half of Lot 11, Conc. 2. where the William Anderson family lived and farmed his grandfather's Robert's farm. James and Rebecca had a son, Bert. James and Rebecca Lowrie farmed his grandfather's Robert's farm. Edmund, the youngest of Robert and Rebecca Lowrie, lived on this branch of the Lowrie family always used a different spelling.

Robert and Inez, purchased his father's farm on the east half of Lot 31, Conc. 2, Nassagaweya. William and his wife, Phoebe Ferrier had a son, James Edward Lowry. William and Phoebe's daughter, Phoebe, and Jack had one daughter, Isabel. Son William John married Mary and north 50 of Lot 31, Conc. 4 Nassagaweya, and raised three children, James, years in Guelph and later returned to the home farm to raise his children James Daniels. James was a member of the Royal Air Force and served in England during the war. They returned to Canada after the war and had two daughters, Mary and Grace. William and Mary Anderson married in the Canadian Army. Russell at one time was married to a woman named Robert, James, Patricia and Hope. William and Phoebe's youngest son, Conc. 2. and ran a mixed farming operation. Although Innes was always preferred a team of horses to farm with. He married a woman named Betty and Patti. Daughter Florence married Sandy Martin from Guelph, Ontario. Gloria, Gary and William, after Sandy's untimely death, were raised by a member of the RCAF during World War II, remained in Canada and lived on the family farm until his death. The youngest son, Mel Mansell and Mel. Mansell and his wife Joan Alexander lived in the village of Eden Mills. Mel never married and remained single. The Lowrie name for over 100 years.
