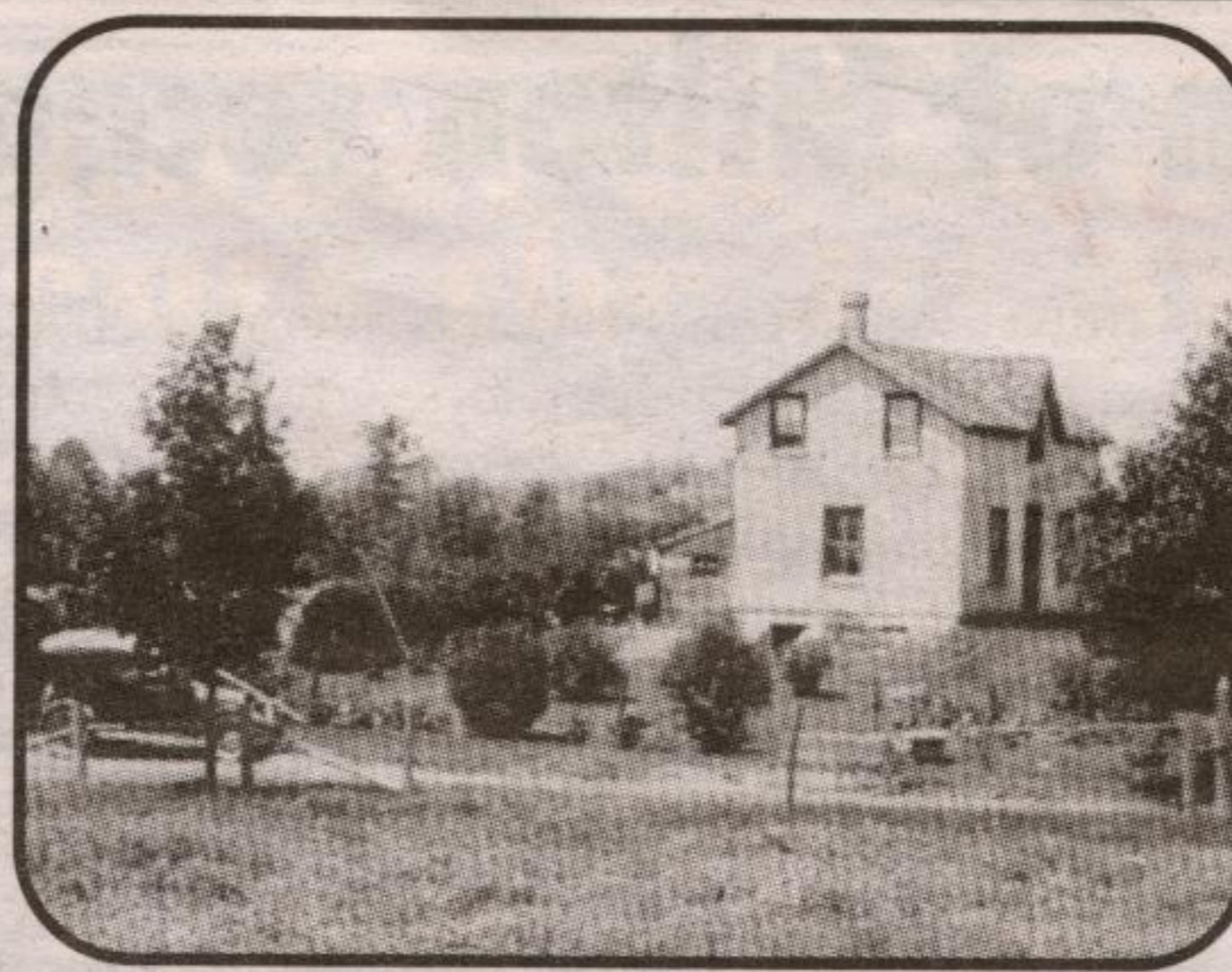


William Lowrie Farm

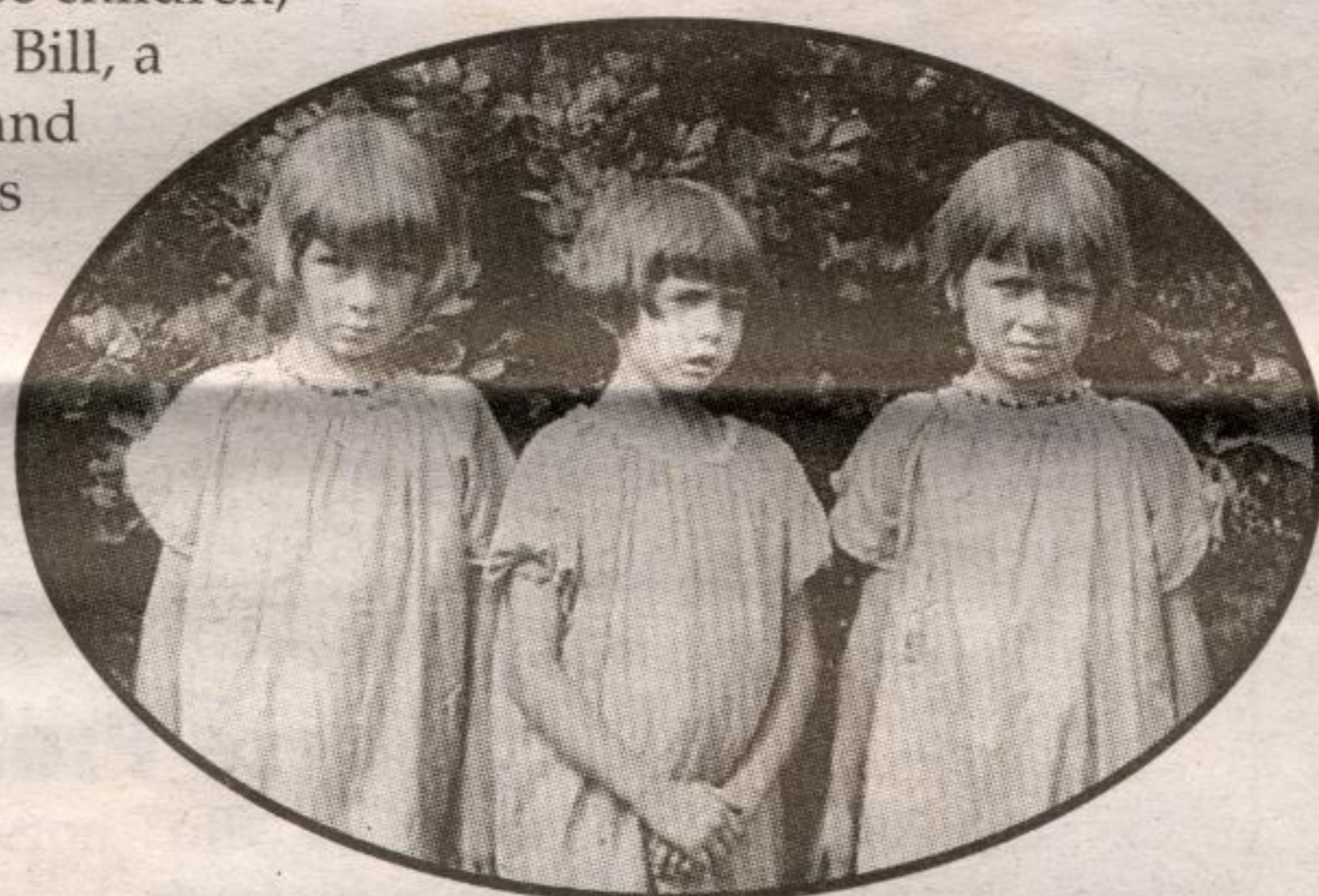

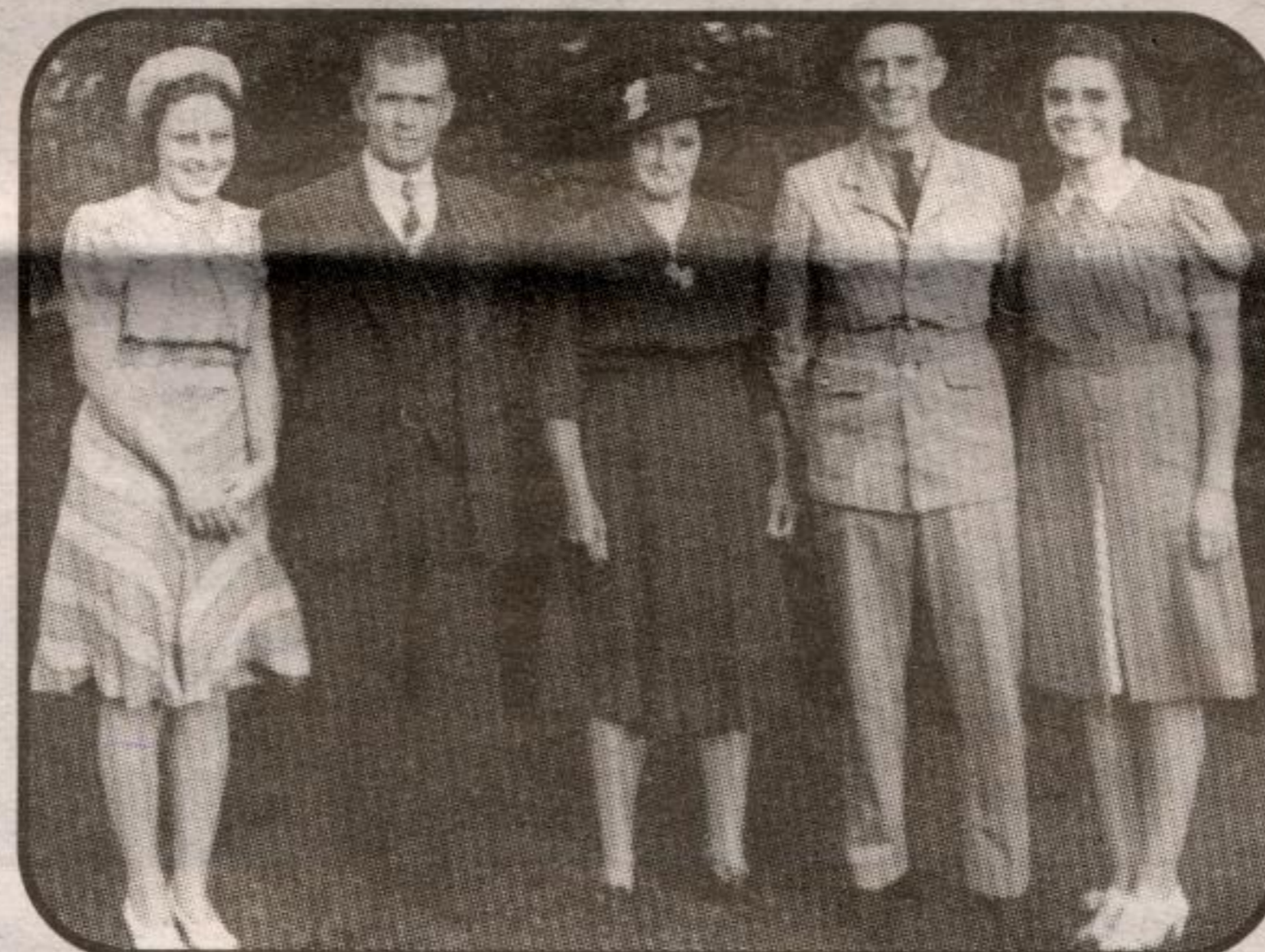
