Mayor Gord Krantz said public awareness of the program is critical. "We want the community to be aware.... You might be able to help a friend or a loved one."

The public units at Town facilities are stored in wall units and they can be

used by anyone, even those without first aid training. Patrick D'Almada, manager of the Milton Leisure Centre, said the Town selected Zoll defibrillators that come with pictographs as well as voice instructions to make it easy for anyone to use the units, including members of Milton's deaf community.

Mr. D'Almada added that there are still sponsorship opportunities for those who would like to support the program. The goal is to raise a total of \$65,000. For more information on making a donation, people can contact Marg Fraser at 905-878-7252, ext. 2156.


