National Treasure





Starring Academy Award winner Nicolas Cage as the gifted historian Benjamin Franklin Gates, this treasure hunter has searched his entire life for a treasure that nobody believed existed. Moved through various continents and hidden by the Founding Fathers of the United States of America, clues to the treasure are buried within the symbols of everyday life. As a treasure hunter and protector, Gates' life long journey has brought him to a most unlikely source; the Declaration of Independence. Gates' desired treasure, also called the Knights Templar Treasure, is rumoured to be the most awesome bounty in human history, and hidden somewhere in America.

For the past six generations, Gates' family has chased after the abundant clues left behind by the Founding Fathers and scoured the country for the treasure. When one of Gates' team members decides to break away from the group and go after the treasure for himself, the race to rescue the treasure from a money hungry mongrel begins. 
