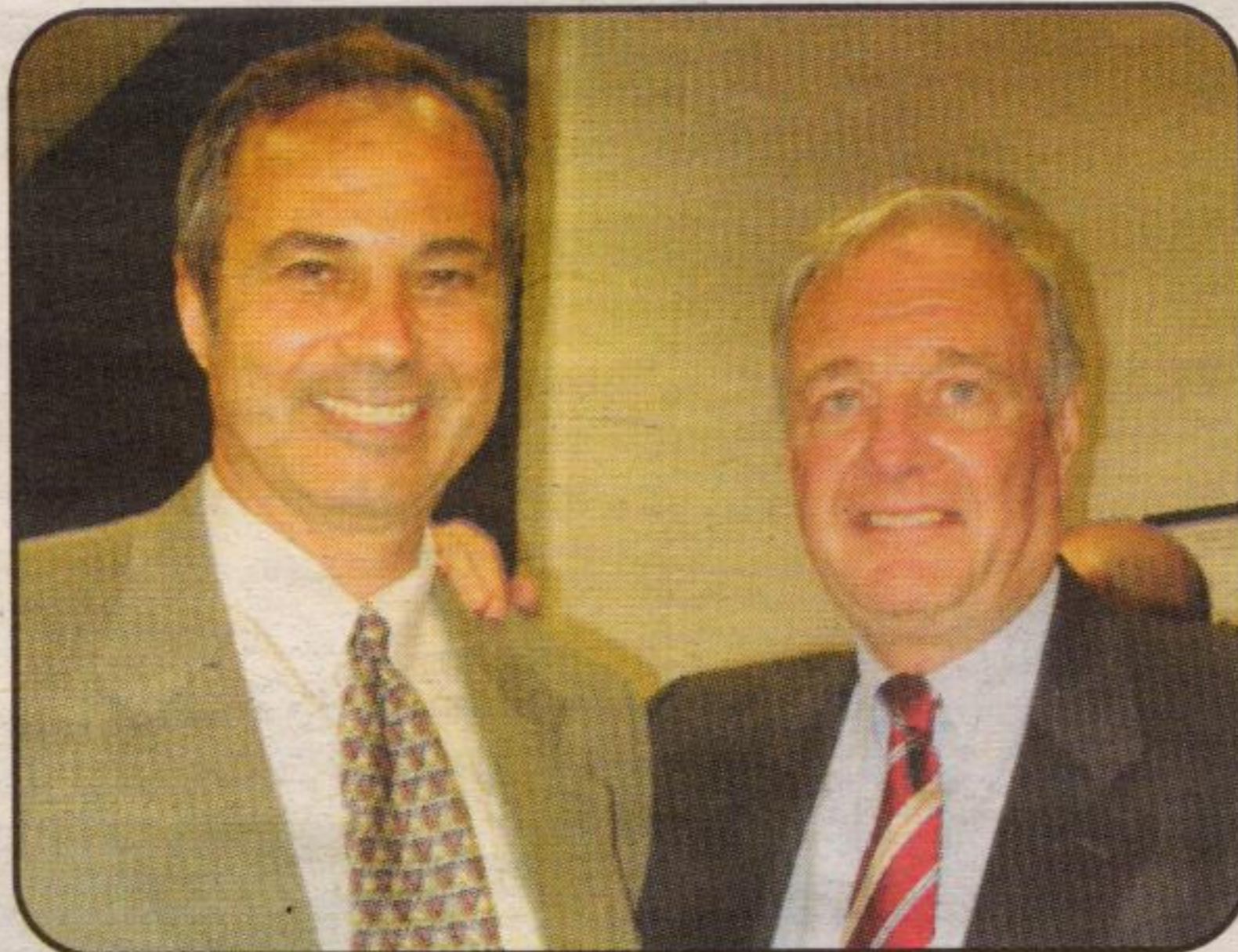

James K Bartleman

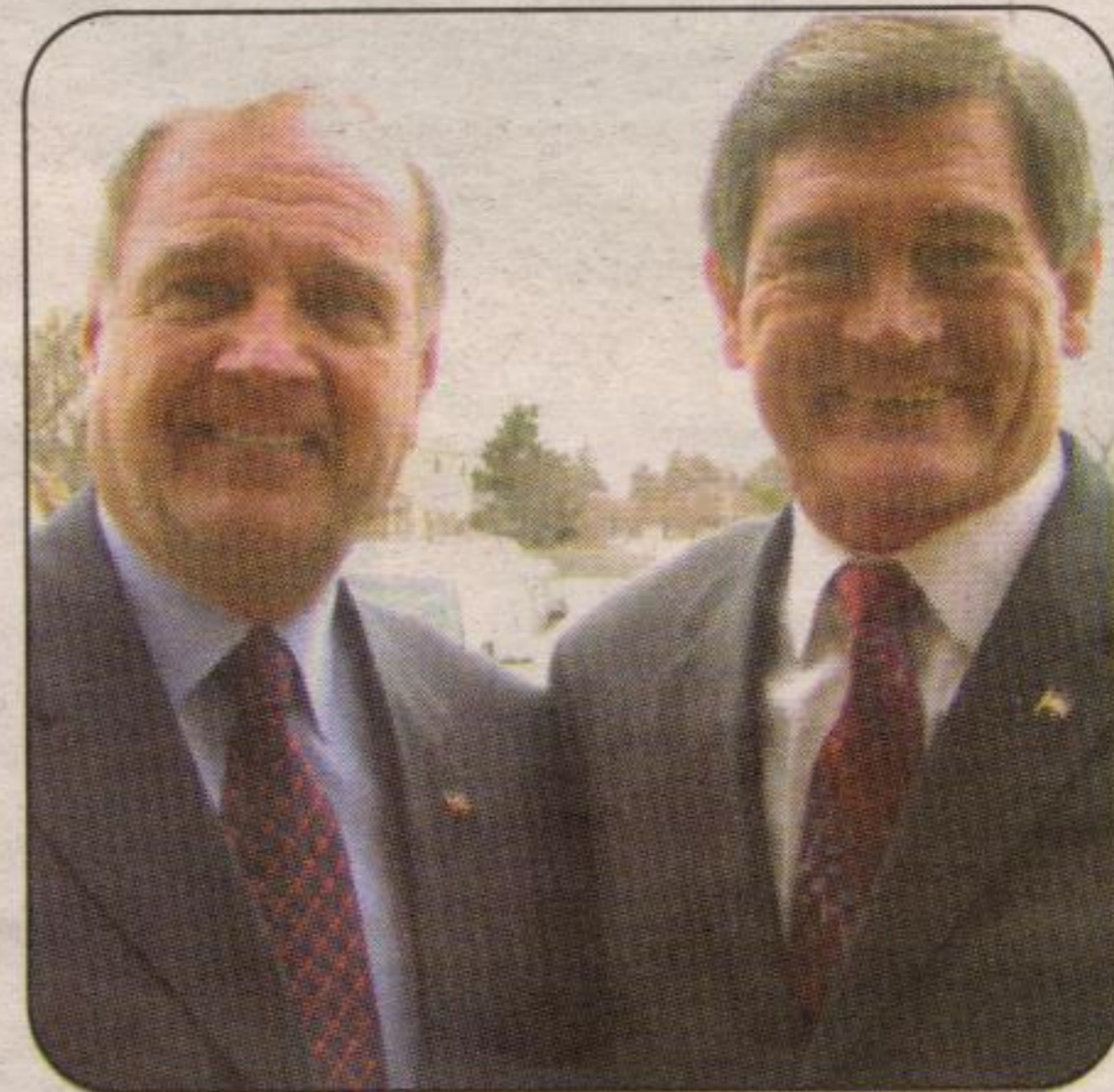
