Firefighters hope Mother Nature lends them a hand

t almost looks like there will be an outdoor ▲ public ice skating rink in Campbellville – at least if the weather co-operates.

Thanks to the efforts of part-time volunteer firefighters from the Milton Fire Department as well as Town employee Jim Cartwright, work began about two weeks ago on setting up an outdoor ice skating rink at the New Campbellville Ball Park. As of this month firefighters had flooded part of the ball diamond at the park with approximately 16,000 gallons of water. But firefighter Jim Finn says Mother Nature has made the work difficult. "We need some cold, cold weather," said Finn, who noted that he knows of no other public outdoor rink in the village.

Finn says he and others involved in the project had the full support of the Milton Fire Department right from the beginning. "Our Fire Chief Larry Brassard was behind it 100 per cent."

Ward 3 Milton Councillor Cindy Lunau says the project was originally suggested by a local resident, and from there things began to take off. "I took the proposal to community services (for the Town). We then identified a place in the park for a rink."

The Town has installed lights, garbage cans, and picnic benches near the rink. And firefighters as well as Lunau and Cartwright

are hoping this will be an ongoing project. Finn says this is the first year for the project, and he hopes it won't be the last. "It's something we would like to continue each year."
