Whether you are from Milton or Toronto it doesn't matter because diseases that affect bone marrow can happen to anyone at any time all over the world," Clem said. "The backing we had from the community in Milton gave us enough courage to try something like this. Otherwise we would never have dreamt of trying to set up the foundation."

Deidre and Friend's Woodbine Race Day includes an invitation to Woodbine's private members club where a buffet meal will be provided, along with door prizes and a draw. The draw prize of a Glen Eagle Golf Resort golf and



NOTICE OF PROPOSED BY-LAW

Outdoor Solid Fuel Combustion Appliances

The Administration and Planning Committee of Council will be considering a proposed by-law to regulate outdoor solid fuel combustion appliances due to public nuisance. Outdoor solid fuel combustion appliances burn a solid fuel such as wood and are used to heat a main structure but are located outside of the structure or in an exterior structure similar to a garden shed. The heat from the unit is then piped into the main structure. This proposed by-law does not pertain to such items as chimeneas or other open air burning.

The by-law, if passed, would require outdoor solid fuel combustion appliances to be located at least 150 metres from side and rear yard property boundaries and at least 130 metres from front yard boundaries.

The Administration and Planning Committee meeting will be held on Monday, February 21, 2004 at 7:30 p.m. in the Council Chambers at Town Hall, 43 Brown Street.
