

FASM kicks off its 2005 workshops

The Fine Arts Society of Milton (FASM) kicks off its 2005 Workshops with a presentation of *Drawing in Pen and Ink*. FASM puts together workshops to provide the opportunity to try new artistic venues without having to commit to full 8 or 10 week sessions, typically provided at local colleges.

On February 26th, Leigh Cockburn will introduce *Drawing in Pen and Ink* for beginners and intermediate artists at the Milton Seniors Activity Centre. Leigh has 35 years of experience teaching art to students including such media as watercolors, oils, acrylics, pencil, charcoal, and pen & ink.

Cockburn stated, "I enjoy sharing my expertise with artists at any level. Although these workshops are basically providing techniques it is hoped that the participants will develop their visual awareness as well."

After a lengthy career as an Art Teacher in the Hamilton region, Leigh recently retired. His work is represented in the Dofasco Collection, the Royal Botanical Gardens, and other businesses in Southern Ontario. He has contributed to the loan collections of the Hamilton Art Gallery, the Burlington Art Centre, and the Confederation Centre in Charlottetown, P.E. I. As Past President of FASM he supports and participates in the many activities of the group. Currently, Leigh operates his gallery Just A Wee Gallery in North Burlington.

The workshops have been scheduled on Saturdays to provide hobby artists who work during the day, an opportunity to participate.

FASM's 2005 Workshops also includes an introduction to life drawing, landscape with watercolors, an introduction to pastels, painting people with oils, silk screening and a garden sketch day.
