

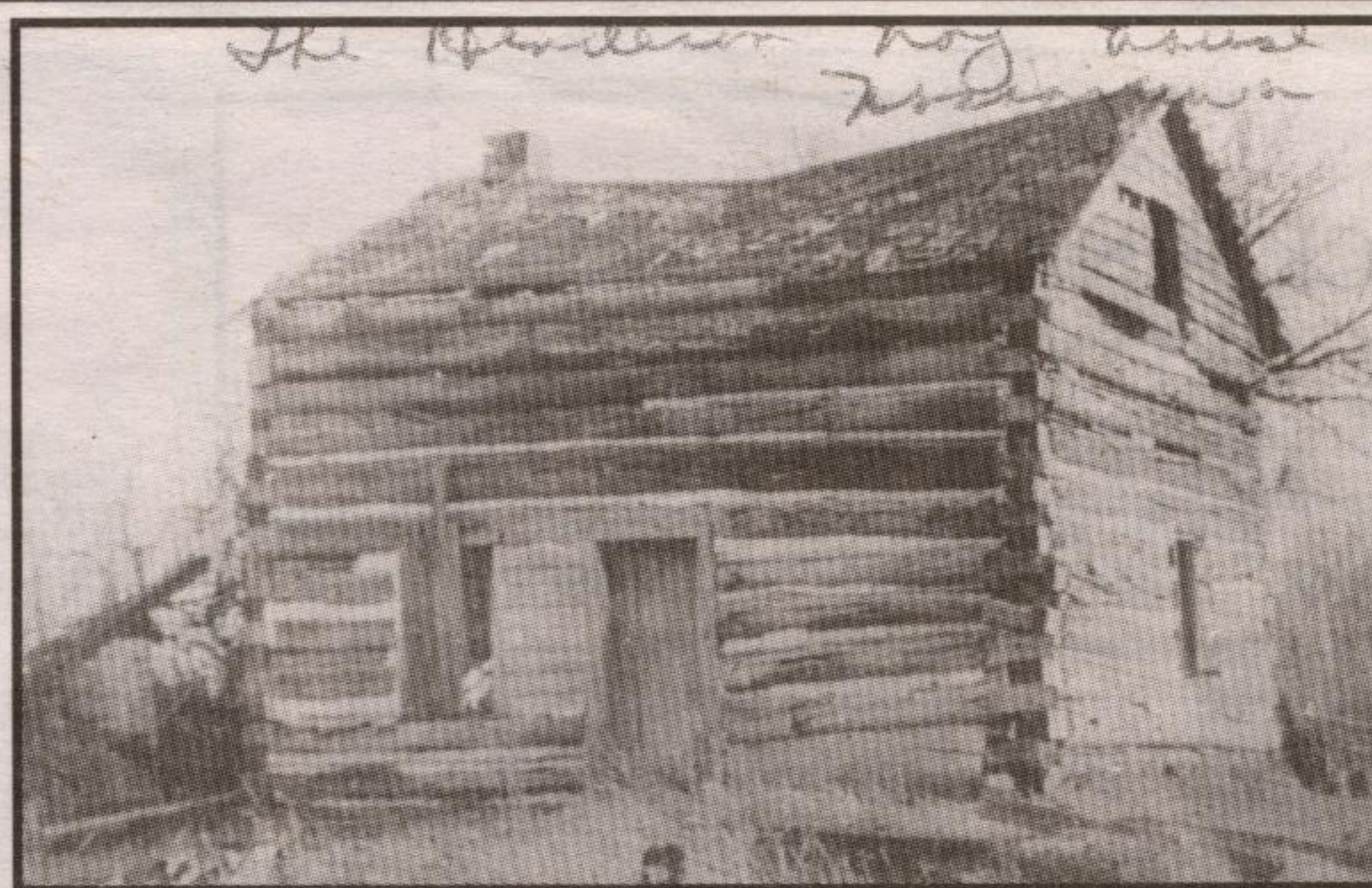
Box Memories

SESSION 6, NASSAGAWEYA TOWNSHIP

Henderson emigrated to Canada in 1856 with their four children from persons likely knew others from Northern Ireland that had settled in the Knowles families. When the Hendersons first arrived in Acton with a night on foot and ended up at home of William Bell at Lot 20, Con. 6. The Hendersons were among the earliest settlers and an original elder of the Nassagaweya Presbyterian Church and purchased the east half of Lot 13, Con. 5 from William J. Morton in 1856. Margaret and Janet Smith, daughters of Jeremiah and Sarah (Bell) Smith and Agnes married John Donaldson. Daughter Martha died shortly after the Hendersons purchased the Lot 20 farm where the family had spent its first night in Acton. John inherited the Lot 13 farm and James the Lot 20 farm which he later passed on to his brother John for his son David A. in 1899. David A. later married Martha and took over the Lot 20 farm after James and Janet retired to Acton. John Henderson became extensively involved in the lumber business in Acton which he continued until his death. Mamie, married Edward Hagerty and farmed in the West as did her sister Sarah Bell Henderson married Alexander Crawford and had three sons: John Joseph, James Little and Charles Little. John died in 1900 in the the early 1960's. He then worked on farms in Ontario and was an avid historian and member of the Nassagaweya Historical Society. He worked years for Texaco in the furnace fuel business in the 1930s and later taught for three years at S.S. No. 9 (Bloomsbury) in Ontario University and later graduated from Knox University in Ontario. He was a member of the Nassagaweya Presbyterian in Haltonville, April 24th, 1945. He lived in Acton for six years. His first pastoral charge was in P.E.I. where he used kettles to boil the sap into syrup. In
