Miltonians honoured for efforts to preserve local history

he Milton Historical Society (MHS) and Heritage Milton held their annual awards ceremony on February 20 to recognize the efforts of Miltonians who have completed heritage projects.

The awards are designed to celebrate the work of residents who contribute to the enrichment of local history whether through architectural renovation, the visual arts, education or writing. But one award recipient, Gail Richardson, suggested that at least part of the credit for her award should go to the community of Milton itself. "It has been a real privilege to bring up our family in Milton. There's a real respect and love of what's in the past (in this community)."


The 2005 awards for the Milton Historical Society included three categories: an educational award, a visual arts award, and a writing award. John McDonald, a well-known local historian and author of Halton Sketches and Halton Sketches Revisited, received an educational award for his historical research on the 1918 influenza epidemic in Milton. Angelo De Medicis of Milton Home Hardware received the visual arts award for historic photos of Milton and an antique tool display, both on display at his store on Steeles Avenue. And the writing award was given to Jim Dills, another well-known historian, for a newspaper insert he produced for the Canadian Champion entitled, "A Look Back – A Peek into Milton's Past."

Recipients of Heritage Milton's awards included Carol and Alan Brooks (renovation to a non-designated building), Bill Mathers of Bill Mathers Men's Wear (renovation of a non-designated building), Berry Smith and Gail Richardson (renovation of a designated building), and the Milton Bible Church (infill development sympathetic to an historic area).


