## from the bookshelf

### Where Race Does Not Matter

Rockwood Professor's new book

Canada is not yet, and certainly has not been, a complete haven for all races. Even leaders like Wilfred Laurier, Mackenzie King or Tommy Douglas, notes author Cecil Foster, have drawn a line in the earth and attempted to shape a utopia of the best people, both by keeping certain races out, and sterilizing people who were mentally or physically handicapped. Control of the future gene pool was part of retaining the "right" people in a great new land.

But Canada, Foster believes, is the pioneer on a journey toward a utopia where a raceless state is the ultimate destination. Have we, he asks, found the elusive answer, the way to untie the knot the world has got itself into, as different people operate for their own good and take separate paths to distinct endings?

"I hope this book allows us to think about not only our current existence but also all that we have overcome and can still hope to achieve. Most of all, it is my way of coming to terms with myself as a black Canadian, and as an immigrant who feels blessed to be living in Canada at this time yet can imagine a society in which all citizens are genuinely equal and share the same rights and privileges. That is what I call genuine multiculturalism - for ultimately multiculturalism is about hope, dreams, idealism, and grasping for what is now beyond reach..."

By recounting our past, remembering and sharing memories, and "venerating all those who chose a different path and who can now be counted among the stalwarts that sacrificed themselves for a specific kind of freedom that is multiculturalism," we make something good happen, although, the author points out, we must also remember the evil and retell the entire story, to prove how difficult the path to multiculturalism was.

Where Race Does Not Matter is a smoothly satisfying read - a thoughtful, provocative presentation of historic fact that is encountered like an armchair chat with a knowledgeable friend. Mr. Foster presents a calm rendering of his teachings, with careful references that are well researched and backed by fact. At the same time that Canada is taking notice of a tragic murder case in Vancouver involving a culture clash between South Asian Canadians and white Canadians, comes his new discussion that promotes promise of a different kind of Canada. Imagine, he asks, a society where children can be judged by the content of their character, rather than the colour of their skin, their place of birth, religion, ancestry, or station in life. The uplifting story that he offers is that a new spirit is among us, a spirit that is as old as humanity, a spectre of another time, and of conflicting dreams and choices. "Multiculturalism is the story of our search for and hopes about social justice." And we are close to that dream, to a time and place where race does not matter.

As Mr. Foster says, "Now we must make sure that the potential in this moment comes forth."

Rockwood resident Cecil Foster is the author of several works of fiction and non-fiction, such as No Man in the House, A Place Called Heaven, Sleep on Beloved. He is an assistant professor at the University of Guelph, and a leading figure on issues of citizenship, culture, politics, race, ethnicity, multiculturalism, and immigration.

### Miss Congeniality 2: Armed and Fabulous

Shortly after disarming a bomb threat at the Miss United States pageant, audiences catch up with Gracie Hart (Sandra Bullock) who is back from her undercover job working and now working as an FBI agent. After all of her media coverage at the pageant in the first Miss Congeniality film, Gracie cannot do her job without being recognized by the public.

In an effort to save face and her job at the bureau, she agrees to become the new face of the FBI. Writing her own account of the story and publishing it in a novel, Gracie soon becomes famous nation wide. Spending more time now at the salon than the shooting range, her stardom ends up getting stalled when she finds out her old friends have been kidnapped. Rather than sitting back and watching the bureau handle the case, Gracie vows to help her friends. The results are a hilarious goose chase that takes her and her bodyguard all across Las Vegas.


Although this film has a few jokes linking it to the original storyline, audiences could easily watch just Armed and Fabulous without it losing any of its effectiveness. With the addition of several new characters, this film is even funnier than its predecessor. Directed by John Pasquin, the film stars Sandra Bullock, Regina King, Enrique Murciano, William Shatner, Heather Burns, and Treat Williams in suitable roles that make the film less clichéd than the original.

With a running time of one hundred and fifteen minutes, this film is a great comedy that is suitable for teens and adults alike. Miss Congeniality: Armed and Fabulous has an MPAA rating of PG-13 for some sex-related humour, but is otherwise harmless.
