Choir to celebrate liberation of Holland

60th anniversary concert on May 7th

Illiton residents Henk and Riet LVerkerk can recall few things about

their experiences as young children in wartime Holland. But one thing that stands

out in their minds is the preciousness of whatever food you had. Talk to them about those years and they both have recollections of Allied food drops. And Henk, who was a 9-year-old boy in May of 1945, can also remember Allied soldiers visiting his hometown of Hilversum during the liberation of Holland. He saw troops coming into town along with tanks and he can recollect people dancing in the streets. "It was a happy time, a very happy time."

Today, on the eve of the 60th anniversary of the liberation of Holland, the Verkerks, like other members of Ontario's Liberation Choir, are preparing to commemorate this historic event.

This year, during the Liberation Choir's twelfth season, choir members will hold a special concert on May 7 at Hamilton Place in recognition

of the liberation of Holland. The large mixed choir, comprised of members from across Halton as well as other parts of southern Ontario, will appear in concert along with the Guelph Symphony Orchestra and Canadian soprano soloist Melissa Gonsalves.

In 1993, the Liberation Choir was founded under the direction of Willem Van Suijdam of Campbellville, who was brought up in the Netherlands. Originally, it was organized to participate in the 1995 celebrations of the 50th anniversary of the liberation of Holland during the Second World War.

Henk and Riet say the evening's musical program is an interesting one that includes Dutch folk music, Canadian music, religious music and wartime songs. Hearing

a large 150-member choir perform these works is a wonderful experience that they would encourage people to enjoy. "It's totally amazing when you hear the whole choir," says Henk.

The Liberation Choir, which received the Arts Acclaim Award of the City of Brampton in 1995, has recorded several CD's and a live video, and presented many concerts. The choir has also gone on three concert tours to Holland.
