



EDITORIAL

I blame it all on Gladiator.

or years one of my favourite movies has been Spartacus, the 1961 sword and sandal epic of an obscure slave's fight against the might of Rome. The true story of how courage and sheer willpower can threaten the greatest empires. Of course Spartacus was a gladiator, but the fight scenes are tastefully handled and we are spared the fountains of blood that seem to be de rigueur in contemporary cinema. Gladiator, gleefully awash with blood and severed limbs, struck a chord with the North American public and in part fuelled the present taste for blood sports on television. The public humiliation that participants in reality shows are willing to endure is a measure of a sickness in our society. Thankfully the human spirit has a built in defense mechanism that deadens us to repeated shocks and our interest and attention wanes.

The bullring of Ottawa is currently spattered with the gore of Liberal politicians running about trying to avoid the Minotaur of the Gomery inquiry. Public interest in the debacle is waning. While 75% of the public will not presently vote Liberal, 68% will not tolerate an election being forced upon the country. Opposition MP's might do well to remember the closing scenes of Spartacus, lest they tempt the nation to crucify them instead along the Appian Way. Blood sports have a nasty habit of switching torturer and tortured before the director can call cut.
