## Georgetown Fire department opens information kiosk



"The information centre is another tool to assist in the delivery of fire safety messages the citizens of our community," says Director of Fire Services Bob Mead.


The new information centre replaces the former one shared with Halton Regional Police ervices and will offer in-person knowledge and expertise from Fire Prevention Staff.
