- Enhanced centre medians to reduce speed and enhance aesthetics;
- · Increased intersection curve radii at selected intersections to improve turning movements; and
- · Increased enforcement to improve compliance with regulations.

The study was conducted in compliance with Schedule "B" of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Document. Subject to comments received as a result of this Notice and the receipt of necessary approvals, the Region will proceed to plan for construction of the improvements, which is scheduled for 2006.


