Hoping for a cure...

Halton recently opened its hearts and its wallets in a successful fundraiser for young Michael Papaioannou. The one-year-old boy, whose parents Peter and Melissa Papaiannou own the popular Trail Eatery restaurant in Campbellville, was diagnosed late last year with Lesch-Nyhan Disease (LND). This is an exceptionally rare disease that has afflicted only four Canadians, with Michael being the youngest case ever diagnosed.

Shortly after the fundraiser, the Papaioannous made the trip to San Diego, where Dr. Nyhan, who discovered the disease over thirty years ago, still maintains a practice. "He was phenomenal," says Melissa of Dr.


Nyhan. "It was like talking to a very knowledgeable friend. We had pages of questions and he spent hours with us, answering each one."

Extensive testing and a skin biopsy were also done on Michael at the time. These tests will serve as a baseline for future tests, acting as a reference point of the disease's progress. Michael and his family will travel to San Diego again in about five months for a follow up visit with Dr. Nyhan.

Then, it will be Dr.Nyhan's turn to visit Michael. The renowned physician has agreed to travel to Ontario next February to be the keynote speaker at the 2nd Annual Michael

Papaioannou Fundraiser. The event will be held on February 25, with Country Heritage Park once again generously donating the Gambrel Barn for the evening's festivities.

"We're very excited about Dr. Nyhan coming," said Peter Papaioannou, who was also quick to express his gratitude for all those who supported the initial fundraiser. "Now we'd like to help raise money for research in the disease, and possibly set up a foundation for other families in need, especially with the cost of any special equipment that's needed. I'd love it if we could help others, because it is really stressful to deal with a sick child and have financial difficulties as well."






