## A good and faithful servant Bob Austin retires after 35 years in government

Right out of the starting gate, Bob Austin, CAO for Halton Hills, sets the record about his departure straight.

"I've been in government for 35 years as of this year, so it's time to retire," he says.

That's quite a respectable amount of time to have spent with the government and Austin is candid.

"There is still lots to do and I feel bad that I won't get it all done, but...I'm tired," he says.

He will officially retire in September of this year, after having taken office in 2003 when his predecessor, Steve Andrews departed.

Austin, who is married and has two daughters, began his career as a civil engineer working for the provincial government at the Ministry of Transportation (MOT). He was born and raised in Sudbury and attended the University of Guelph.

After working in Ontario's Great North, Austin eventually made his way to Toronto and the Acton where he has resided since 1974 when he began working with Halton Hills as the town engineer managing the town's roads and all of the town services that go with them.

He has, he says, touched a lot of things that have happened in town.

"I've literally been here for every development in Halton Hills," says Austin. "Everything that's happened since then has crossed my desk."

Austin believes that Mayor Bonnette, asked why he chose him for the job of CAO, would say it was because of his knowledge of the town and it's staff.

He himself believes that his ability to make fair decisions and team-player tendencies, along with having the respect and trust of staff, certainly helped

"They were looking for someone to steady the ship and bring back a personality to the position," he says.

Of his accomplishments since taking office, the ones that have left a lasting

impression with him include the work done on the strategic plan; a deal that saw the non-residential tax assessment ratio dealt with in a manner that encouraged industrial development in the community and more recently, a contract settlement with town staff.

Asked what aspect of engineering prepared him for his work as CAO, Austin pointed to the mindset of an engineer.

"If you're an engineer you can think things through. I'm not sure there's a better grounding for the job," says Austin.

People, he says, are what he'll miss the most about his job when he retires.

"People are what it's all about and I've worked with some super people. Its nurtured friendships out of business relationships," says Austin.

And just what does he plan to do with all of his spare time once he retires?

"There's nothing preconceived about my destiny after that," says Austin but he does admit that he may indulge in a little travel and maybe even a little more golf.

"I golf a lot," says Austin, "but not necessarily well."

Austin, it appears, will have some time to fix that.

# Brent Colbert seeks Conservative nomination


