Region moves ahead with forestry management plan

espite concerns registered by a handful of councillors and trail users, Halton Regional council has decided to move forward with a Forestry Management Plan, the details of which were presented at a meeting on May 4.

The report, presented by representatives from Gartner Lee Limited and Silv-Econ Limited, outlines a plan that is purported to meet the objectives of the Region's official plan for keeping the forests in a natural state while allowing for a number of passive recreational uses.

"You have a beautiful forest, it's really a jewel in southern Ontario," said Dave Puttock, from Silv-Econ. "It contains natural heritage aspects that are not contained in other forests."

The forests, which now consist of more than 660 hectares in 14 tracts, are to be managed with those natural heritage features kept in mind.

The trick will be to manage the forest in a way that allows those and other species to flourish while at the same time permitting the pubic access to the forest for hiking and other recreational activities.

"It was very much an environment first approach looked at by the committee," said Puttock.

Snarl of the wild

Alleged wolf attack in Nassagaweya

ature is sometimes just a little too close for comfort and this was certainly the case for Diane Bagnall, a local resident whose dog was on the receiving end of what she believes was a wolf attack.

On May 5 at about 9:15 pm, Bagnall went out to her barnyard with her two dogs to check on the horses.

"I have never had any feeling of nervousness when going to the barn at night," said Bagnall.

As she headed toward the barn with her two dogs, Rolf, a German wirehair pointer, tore off towards the drive shed, leaving Bagnall and her other dog, Roz, a standard poodle to carry on.

"A terrible growling and snarling came from the direction of the drive shed. I panicked when I heard my dog start to scream," said Bagnall.

Thinking perhaps a raccoon had bitten the dog, she headed off to check on him and after calling Rolf, he came out limping.

"Behind him I saw first one large silver grey wolf trotting towards me and then another appeared from the darkness," said Bagnall.

John Pisapio, a wildlife biologist from the Ministry of Natural Resources says they field these calls all the time but points out that wolf range in Ontario doesn't really begin until the Canadian Shield, around the Muskokas and onto Continued on page 3




