
Lacrosse Cup Final creates family rivalry

Both teams boast Halton players including an uncle and nephew

/ hen the National Lacrosse League (NLL) holds its Champion's Cup Final this Saturday (May 14) at the Air Canada Centre (ACC), it will be the Toronto Rock versus the rival Arizona Sting. There is also a local flavour to the rivalry of the game.

Georgetown's Peter Veltman of the Arizona Sting will be playing against his uncle, Jim "Scoop" Veltman of Stouffville, a member of the Toronto Rock.

Peter Veltman, who has played lacrosse since the age of 4, played bantam lacrosse in Georgetown and Junior B in Georgetown at the age of 15. He played for B.C.'s Coquitlam Adanacs as well as the Arizona Sting. Peter's uncle Jim Veltman has had a distinguished career with the NLL. He was named MVP for the league during the 2003-2004 season


Sandy Chapman of Acton, a Toronto Rock forward says Halton Hills may not have the longest standing lacrosse tradition, but it has produced a number of professional lacrosse players. Chapman, who attends Brock University in St. Catharines, has played for the Toronto Rock since 2002 and at 24 he's already been to two Champion's Cup Finals. Sandy Chapman began playing lacrosse at the age of 5 in Acton, playing for the Acton Rams and the Milton Mavericks. He turned professional at the age of 20 when the Toronto Rock drafted him.

Toronto has dominated the NLL championships over the years winning four championships, but Chapman still doesn't think it will be that easy to take the sting out of Arizona's team. He's making no bets on the outcome of the game, which will be watched by thousands of fans at the ACC and televised on The Score (3:30 p.m., May 14).

Chapman says the Arizona Sting is a young team with some excellent players including Peter Veltman. Chapman is rooting for the Toronto Rock, but it wouldn't surprise him if Arizona ends up winning the championship.
