#### Oakville plants hundreds of trees for Arbor Week

O akville celebrated Arbor Week as thousands of students and dozens of Town Forestry staff were involved in tree plantings throughout the community.

The Town planted 1,000 oak seedlings at prime sites in Iroquois Shoreline Woods (ISW) Park including the site of Oakville's recent prescribed burn — a deliberately set and carefully controlled low fire that does not harm larger trees but stimulates growth and encourages regeneration of natural and planted seedlings.

In addition, 1,000 grade four students at 28 schools across town participated in Arbor Week through a private lesson with Oakville's Forestry staff. Students learned about proper tree planting methods and how to care for them by planting a sugar maple tree on their school ground. A num-

ber of councillors were able to visit with schools for the tree planting lessons on May 3 and May 4 including Councillors Ralph Robinson (Ward 1), Cathy Duddeck (Ward 2), Janice Wright (Ward 6) and Allan Elgar (Ward 4).

"It is encouraging to know that the citizens of Oakville are as concerned as we are about establishing and maintaining forest regeneration projects," said John McNeil, Manager of Forestry and Cemetery Services. "The inclusion of the schools in this initiative was very impor-


