On Halton's Draft Tree Bylaw and Revised Environmental Impact
Assessment Guidelines

The Draft Halton Tree Bylaw, intended to replace the current Bylaw adopted by Council in 1983, has been further revised after extensive public consultation in March 2004 and subsequent agency and staff review earlier this year. The Revised Bylaw will be presented at a Public Open House for comment before a final version is prepared for Regional Council's consideration.

Also, the Halton Regional Official Plan Five Year Review identified the need to revise Halton's Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Guidelines. Regional Council approved the existing EIA Guidelines in 1979. The purpose of an EIA is to identify and assess the potential environmental impacts and mitigation measures of a land-use development proposal. A draft of the guidelines is now available for public review and a Public Open House to consider both the Tree Bylaw and the EIA Guidelines is scheduled for:



# GRASSGYCling

Grass clippings will not be collected.

Please grasscycle by leaving clippings on your lawn.

Residents are encouraged to leave grass on the lawn as a valuable nutrient source. Grass clippings are 90% water, so they decompose quickly, releasing nitrogen and other valuable nutrients back into your lawn.

#### Tips for a Healthy Lawn

- Don't Mow too Low: Mowing your lawn to a height of 6 to 8 centimetres
   (2.5 to 3 inches) will encourage longer roots resulting in stronger
   grass and shade the soil, reducing moisture loss.
- Longer grass will also choke out weeds.
- Keep the blades of your mower sharp, and alter the direction each time you cut the grass.
- Avoid cutting the grass when it is wet. Your lawn requires only about 2.5 centimetres (1 inch) of water per week.
