Halton residents get set to support annual Rebecca Run Organizers hope to raise \$100,000 this year for SMA research

nce again Halton residents will get a chance to support fundraising initiatives to help find a cure or treatment for Spinal Muscular Atrophy (SMA), a genetic disease that affects five-year-old Rebecca van Fraassen of Limehouse.

On Saturday, June 4, Georgetown Esso is offering car washes to customers in exchange for voluntary donations. And beginning on June 13, Sobeys in Acton will be holding its annual Wings for SMA fundraiser. For two weeks, the grocery store will sell \$2 raffle tickets offering customers an opportunity to win a barbecue prize

package. Halton Hills resident Erich Feibel, who volunteers his time to help out with fundraising, says the event was a "tremendous success" last year thanks to the kindness and generosity of local residents. He noted that the program has expanded this year to other Sobeys stores, including three in Brampton and one in Aurora.

Proceeds from both events will go to the Esso Rebecca Run for Spinal Muscular Atrophy, a fundraising event named for Rebecca, who attends Senior Kindergarten at St. Joseph's School in Acton. The annual event will be held at Fairy Lake in Newmarket on July 9. All proceeds from the run are directed to Families of Spinal Muscular Atrophy Canada (FSMAC), a charitable organization that funds research on the disease.

Rebecca's aunt Louise Smith,


who organizes the run each year, says a large number of Halton residents have made a commitment to raising money for the Esso Rebecca Run and FSMAC, both as participants and sponsors. Aside from Georgetown Esso, Hinton Esso in Milton is sponsoring the event along with 10 other Esso dealers. And Smith says about 50 to 60 area residents are taking part in this year's run.

Since the Rebecca Run began in 2001 the event has raised approximately \$255,000. This year organizers hope to raise \$100,000.


