

ot only will the Arts Milton Festival offer fun for the whole family on May 28, but newly lowered ticket costs for the evening's Grandstand Finale Concert will make it even more accessible. Tickets for the extravagant evening of entertainment, featuring local favourites Life Time Drive (L.T.D.) and Elvis Tribute Artist Steve Kabakos, are available for a cost of \$20 each for adults, \$10 for students and a special package pricing of \$50 for a family of four or more.

Look for L.T.D. to perform not only a variety of rock cover tunes, but also a number of their own original songs as well.

World renowned winner of the 2001 Images of the King World Competition Steve Kabakos will immediately follow L.T.D. for a captivating two hour portrayal of the King. "This is really exciting for us," says June. "It will be really amazing to see Steve perform that night with his entire twelve-piece ensemble."
